The Church as "Mercy Place"

The theme for the North Dakota District convention is "Now You are the people of God." It comes from the second chapter of First Peter, which is Peter's exhortation to Christians to live as the people of God among the pagans. Not long after the theme verse Peter says:

"Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us."

That exhortation only makes sense to those who are the people of God and know it because they "have received mercy." The church has always been a "mercy place" and sought ways to show God's mercy to others because of mercy shown to them in the doing and dying of Jesus. One Roman governor writing a report to his superior said: "In our Roman



cities the streets are filled with beggars and the homeless, the crippled and the poor. Wherever the pagans (read Christians) are influential this is not so. How can this be?"

We pray that our district in convention will focus on helping us all to make our churches truly "mercy places" not only in words but in deeds.




p.m. in the fellowship hall. Coffee and refreshments will be served. There will be a short program at 3 p.m. put on by some of the

Stewardship Article (From our Synod)

Many people look forward with excitement to months with special occasions or celebrations. But for some people, August seems to be one of those months when there is not much to celebrate. Major League baseball players refer to this month as the "Dog Days of August."

Life is like that. Not every day, week or month is as exciting as some others, but each one presents another opportunity for service. Redeemed stewards look for opportunities to make the most of time because time is an important gift from God. Making the most of time can take us in a number of different directions. Included among these directions are time for meditation and reflection, time for rest and time for planning ahead.

God's Old Testament people sometimes grumbled about getting the Sabbaths over so they could get back

to selling wheat, skimping the measure, boosting the price and cheating with dishonest scales...(Amos 8:5) Rather than observing the Sabbath as a day of rest, reflection and worship, they saw it as a wasted day.

Perhaps August has been given to us from God to use like a Sabbath rest. God's redeemed stewards, in cooperation with and encouragement from fellow redeemed stewards, manage all of life and life's resources [including time] for God's purposes. Other life resources include



money, relationships, abilities, care of our bodies and creation, sharing the Gospel of salvation in Jesus and so much more! Let August be a reminder that we are God's stewards 365 days a year and we live freely and joyfully as His stewards in August as well as the other eleven months of the year. Have a refreshing and blessed August!

Faith blossoms under shade of family tree

One of the major concerns facing the church is the exodus of its young members. Even here at Beautiful Savior, we are left scratching our heads sometimes, asking ourselves: "why do kids disappear after confirmation?"

Some say maybe the church should adopt a totally different confirmation program - one that is "current and dynamic." While I believe we should (and do) offer material that keeps our kids engaged, nowhere in Scripture do I remember Jesus calling us to be entertained by His words. Last I checked. His call was to denv ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him. Last I checked. He asked us to die to the world so that we can live for God – thanks to the forgiveness and freedom won on the cross.

So here is something that might surprise you: In my experience, limited as it is, the youth who are involved and stay involved in the church are the ones who have parents who are involved and stay involved in the church. Parents have an enormous impact on the way their kids view faith and its relevance to their lives.

Please do not think that I am dismissing the role of the Holy Spirit and how He works mightily through Word and Sacrament. Please do not think that I am saying the church does not share in the role of helping children grow in faith. But the church can only do so much. Pastors and Sunday school teachers have about two hours a week with kids – and that's if those kids are coming every week. Parents, however, affect and influence their children each and every day.

When families make faith an integral part of everyday life and walk according to the way the Spirit empowers them, kids take notice. If families only make faith and church something they do with vigor during the confirmation years, is it any wonder that the kids see faith as a three-year program? On the other hand, a family with an identity firmly rooted in Christ raises kids in the same mold.

The Bible tells us to "train a child in the way to go and even when he is old, he will not depart from it," (Prov. 22.6).



Likewise, Paul encourages fathers to bring up their children in the "training and instruction in the Lord," (Eph. 6:4).



Perhaps you as a parent do not know where to begin in making faith part of your family's everyday life. To this end, I would encourage you to use some sort of family devotion. This

helps to bring your family together emotionally and spiritually. One such resource can be found at www.faithmoments.com. This web site offers faith-building activities for the whole family, parenting helps and tips, educational tools and resources and weekly animated devotions. Materials are appropriate for preschool-aged kids to those in fourth grade.

Although parents do not create faith in their children, they certainly can create an environment in which faith is nourished, encouraged and fed. Indeed, faith can blossom when under the shade of the family tree.
