Unpleasant things happen to us. We lose what we think we cannot live without. Pain comes to those we love. We wonder why life is not fair. Anxiety can seep into our hearts.

Now as we read the Bible, it is very realistic. Scripture acknowledges that there is sickness and death, despair and persecution. There are disasters caused by people like wars. There are also natural disasters such as tornados, earthquakes and floods. We are surrounded by evil things that can and do happen to us at times.

Now if all we had to look forward in life to was the next bad thing to happen to us, we would only be in despair. However, danger, trials and oppression are never too much for the one who has faith in God. They were not too much for Job, they were not too much for Jeremiah and they were not too much for Jesus. Evil is always temporary. The worst does not last for God's people. Nothing counter to God's justice has any eternity to it. Paul's witness was:

"There isn't any temptation that you have experienced which is unusual for humans. God, who faithfully keeps his promises, will not allow you to be tempted beyond your power to resist. But when you are tempted, he will also give you the ability to endure the temptation as your way of escape."

(1 Cor. 10:13 NET)



### Evil arises as we depart from God's Word.

Today's secular viewpoint portrays man as an ever-evolving creature in terms of both physiology and moral discernment. As questions of proper social norms arise today, our culture tosses aside the Biblical world view as uninformed, irrational and antiquated. The Biblical teachings on the creation of the world, the fall into sin, the single-flesh union in marriage, the unnatural practice of homosexuality all have been labeled as nothing more than the product of a culture that obviously did not know any better.

Sadly, this view has even crept into our churches. But man's morality does not improve with HIS discernment. Let's be honest, man's

right to choose between right and wrong has been grossly overstated. The Lutheran confessions adhere to the fact that humans can choose good and evil in external matters.

It can talk about God, offer God acts of worship, obey rulers and parents and keep back the hand from murder, adultery and theft, but God endowed humans with an the inclination of the heart is never one of choice: "Apart from the Holy Spirit, human hearts lack the fear of God and trust in God."

Before the fall, God's word also tells us humans did not "choose" to be good. They WERE good. In Genesis 1:31, God deems the crown of His creation "very good!" This was not just a tendency; it was a God-given gift. God had given the command not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in Gen. 2:16-17; yet man lived in perfect, peaceful, intimate communion with God as cited in Gen. 2:19 and following. The New Testament also writes that the new man is "renewed in knowledge after the image of Him that created him," (Col 3:10) and "created after God in righteousness and true holiness," (Eph. 4:24).

God created Adam and Eve in his

image. Many people have said this means that

intellect and will that included the right to choose, but Francis Pieper masterfully writes: "The image of God in man consisted in much more than in his possession of his intellect and will, in his personality; it consisted in the RIGHT disposition of his intellect and will, in his knowledge of God and the will to do ONLY God's will. And his sensuous desires - if we wish to distinguish this from intellect and will - were free from all ungodly propensity."

So what happened? God commanded the couple not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil or there would be consequence. However, the serpent comes along with claims that the couple would not die and that the two would "become like God." Eve is deceived by the serpent's truth claims, who takes the fruit, then offers some to Adam.

It is important to remember that we are not like Adam and Eve before the fall. Before the two eat the fruit, they have no propensity for evil nor "know" it. Please know that I am not trying to get Adam and Eve off the hook here; they made a drastic mistake. However, the mistake was not choosing an innate evil inclination of wanting to be like God, the mistake was an external act of listening to something or someone other than God – Eve being deceived by the serpent and Adam following his wife's lead.

After the fall, everything changed. Once Eve and Adam ate the fruit, mankind's holy disposition was compromised. No longer having an innate inclination to do God's will, Adam and Eve become inward-focused and self-centered. Originally created good, mankind's inclination now included intimate knowledge of evil and an inclination to appease himself instead of God.

Paul collects quite a few quotes from the Old Testament to make this case of humanity's condition after the fall: "There is no one righteous, not even one; there is no one who understands, no one who seeks God. All have turned away; they have together become worthless; there is no one who does

good, not even one. Their throats are like open graves; their tongues practice deceit. The poison of vipers is on their lips. Their mouths are full of cursing and bitterness. Their feet are swift to shed blood; ruin and misery mark their ways, and the way of peace they do not know. There is no fear of God before their eyes," (Rom. 3:10b-18). Indeed, as Luther notes, after the fall, a human's will is bound to sin and rebellion against God.

However, Paul gives us the blessed assurance that although we are ungodly sinners steeped in a sorry state of rebellion, God rescues us from sin, death and the power of Satan despite our lurid credentials. In other words, nothing inherent in us moves God to act, but He does so out of his loving character: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us," (Romans 5:8).

But the gift of God does not end there. Indeed, Christ promises that through the power of the Holy Spirit,

our image is being renewed as it was created. Still, however, the sinful inclination remains. That is why God must work in us over and against our sinful will. Paul writes, "No one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. We have not received the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God that we may understand what God has freely given us" (1 Cor. 2:11b-12).

It must be noted that we do not then choose the good in our inclination and according to true (spiritual) goodness and righteousness. Instead, we must totally and fully rely on something outside of us. So we look to God's saving grace in Jesus Christ. We look to the Spirit as He comes as the voice of God, revealing the truth of God's Word as recorded in the Bible. We look to Him to work in us. Our choices are not as wise as we might think unless we cling to God and what he has revealed. As Christians, therefore, we constantly let the Word of God speak to us to transform and guide us: "For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law," (Gal. 5:16-18).

Increasingly, secular humanism claims that the ways of the past remain chained to the uninformed, irrational (read Biblical) beliefs of culture at the time. But evil comes as we depart from God's word. Sin is anything done against God and his will. Scripture would not urge us to avoid sin if there still was not a standard that God had placed for us and our lives. Although we are not under the law, we may still benefit greatly from its instruction. In 2 Tim. 3:16, Paul tells us that "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be equipped for every good work."

If we leave a Biblical world view behind, we leave behind what is truly good and we ignore the word of God as a means of grace and delivery vehicle for the Holy Spirit. In an ironic twist, as we pursue our own ideas of good, we only go further astray. Evil -- if it is to be successful -- is never portrayed as evil. It is promoted as good. But as we have seen, we must take God at His word; then and only then do we really know what it true, right and good.
