What Does It Mean To Be Part of a Church?


I heard the term "church shopping" recently and regret church membership has taken on such a consumerist bent. As a consumer, you make many choices, and those choices come with increasing personal choice! "Have it your way" marks today's mindset of extreme personalization.

But joining a church does not fit into this category.

When we come to a church as a consumer, thinking only about what the church can provide, we miss the deeper meaning of what it means to belong to a church in the first place.

Of course, we are dependent on the church for our spiritual health and well-being; indeed, for faith itself given through the Holy Spirit working through the means of grace, Word and Sacrament. We are not so much keeping the faith as being kept in the faith.

But as Paul writes to the church in Ephesus to encourage mature discipleship, he doesn't focus on fierce independence and personal choices, he likens the members of the church to members of a body:



"And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love." Eph. 4:11-16a.

Our place in the church is not just as individuals but instead as part of a whole. Each part has a function to fulfill, with specific and particular gifts that one brings to help the body function properly and effectively. The body needs all members functioning together. In fact, Paul makes the case that each member is indispensable. The body cannot and does not work properly without all its members working together. An eye cannot say, "let somebody else see for the body. I will remain idle." And if members war against one another, it harms the entire body.

But how many of us view church membership in this way? When we come to church as a pure consumer, our view of the church always highlights what others can do for us instead of seeing that God has joined us together for a specific purpose. That purpose is not our own edification and savage appeasement but to "attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of Christ." We do this not by following our own whims and fancy but as instruments of our head, Jesus Christ, growing in knowledge of Him and building up one another in love.

As we move forward in the coming months, consider your place in the church. Consider how God may use you to build up others in the church. Consider giving generously of your time, talents and treasures, building up others as you have been built by the love of God in Christ Jesus.

You are not a consumer here, you are a members of His body!
