Our Lenten worship services will address some popular assumptions we find in our society today. Such as:

#### Ash Wednesday, March 9 "Life's Better in My Hands"

Hand your life over to someone else? No way! "Life is better in my hands." Hmmm... Jesus teaches us, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."

#### Wednesday, March 16 "I'm Being True to Myself"

But do you really know who you are? Really? Jesus says, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Can we know what we're doing if we don't know who we truly are?

#### Wednesday, March 23 "This is it???"

Jesus promised the thief, "Today you will be with me in Paradise." Is this just some "pie in the sky" wishful thinking? Since life is short, shouldn't we expect the best here and now?

Take a break from work and attend our business builder luncheon and Bible study. Our group meets from noon -1



### In Christ, Being Undead is Not Grave News

What's with all the zombie mania lately? There's zombies at the movies, zombies on TV, zombies in videogames. There's rocker-director Rob Zombie – zombies everywhere! You can't seem to escape them. And don't even get me started on vampires.

The public's fascination with the undead probably has reached unhealthy levels. As Christians, we might be tempted to stay away from the subject. There's only one problem: the Bible tells us that the dead WILL rise from the grave one day.

Don't worry. That's not grave news. The undead have gotten a bad rap. Contrary to popular lore and legend, the undead are not mindless creatures of decay seeking to prey upon fellow humans. The Bible paints a much brighter picture of those who come back from the grave in Christ.

Read these comforting words of Paul: "So it will be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body," (1 Cor. 15:42-44).

Take note here that Paul is not only referring to new life in Christ through the forgiveness of sins, he speaks of an actual resurrection and new life because there is forgiveness of sins in Christ. When resurrected, our physical bodies will be reunited with our souls. The good news gets better: When resurrected, our bodies will be similar to Christ's glorified physical body (Luke 24;36-43). That's the

When resurrected, our bodies will be similar to Chris' glorified physical body.

(Luke 24;36-43). That's the culmination of the fullness of God's restoration in Christ, who suffered, died and rose again to give us life.


On the last day, death will then be removed completely from all those in Christ. The grave will never touch them again. How much more "un" dead can you get? As Paul writes, "then the saying that is written will come true: 'Death has been swallowed up in victory.'"

So throw out any stale undead dread. As Christ calls us out of the grave, life is all that remains in us.
