## "Rejoice!"

One of the things I love about this time of the year is the music. As I set up and decorate our Christmas tree each year, I listen to Christmas carols. Like many people, these songs contribute to the joyful mood of decorating for Christmas. But many Christmas carols do more for us. They convey a message of hope, love and peace. This should be no surprise. The first Christmas was like this.

The shepherds were the first ones to hear a word and a song about the joy, hope and peace that comes with the birth of a Savior. This message was brought by angels to the shepherds. At first, they were very afraid. I would have been too! The appearance of angels is unnatural. However, these messengers came as bearers of good news. "I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people," (Luke 2:10b).



As you read the words of the angel, notice how the message is for "all people" and not just for the shepherds. The phrase "all people" includes you and me. That is what makes the celebration of Christmas so grand. It is not only that people long ago received some precious news, but we continue to be the beneficiaries of it as well. Jesus is our Savior. He alone is the one who brings true hope, joy, peace and love.

The angels concluded their time with the shepherds by singing a song of praise to the Lord, the first Christmas carol.

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:13-14)

We carry on that tradition of praising God as we sing and listen to songs about our Savior. Throughout the month of December, we will sing Advent hymns and Christmas carols. I encourage you to attend the various services so you can be built up through God's word and song. I also pray that your life would convey the beautiful love of God just like the Christmas carols do.

I am so glad when Christmas comes, Let anthems fill the air! He opens wide for every child His paradise so fair.



## Black Friday Nostalgia Connected to Good Friday's Sacrifice

A time-honored tradition ended this November. For the first time, I spent Black Friday without my mom, who was back home. Mom always had set aside Black Friday as a special day of uninterrupted Christmas camaraderie with her kids. Initially, the tradition involved going to Mark Twain mall in St. Charles, Mo., to see Santa Claus arrive in a helicopter. Saint Nick's grandiose descent from the skies served as a reminder that Christmas was near. Now that Santa was ready, we accommodated his generosity, surveying the scene for the latest toys and making a wish list.

The traditions evolved as time went on. Some years, we took my grandmother, whose credentials as a professional shopper bordered on the legendary. A few years, our dad came along and we made our way into the city to gather around its magnificent window displays. As we aged, the morning docket shifted from seeing Santa to chasing red-eye door busters, crazy coupons and the promise of big savings.

Despite the circumstances, Black Friday always delivered an adventure. But we never measured Black Friday success by purchases or savings; the day beamed brightly because you noticed that the world had changed in so many magical ways because Christmas was coming.

Today, the stakes have been raised. Midnight sales and too-good-to-be-true discounts have produced a psychological monster of competitive hoarding. Maybe I'm over-romanticizing the past and it was always this way. In any case, it's easy to get swept away in the Black Friday mindset; the season becomes nothing more than an itch to grab the next deal. As one pundit put it, "it's really about getting us at a very deep level to have insatiable appetites for stuff we don't need and many times can't afford."

Maybe we all realize that there is something that every single man, woman and child on the face of the planet really needs and yet cannot purchase themselves: it is the forgiveness of sins. Thanks be to God that this has been won for us by Jesus Christ. As we look at the price Jesus paid – not on Black Friday, but Good Friday, we know the world truly has changed. His forgiveness and mercy and steadfast love are ours in full -- much more valuable than any Black Friday deal. In Christ, we have the best deal of all: God and sinners reconciled! God's riches at Christ's expense. That's where the joy of Christmas resides.

On some level, I realize my Black Friday joy only meant something substantial when it took its roots from my Good Friday joy. For me, the lights, the decorations and the cheer, all pointed to the angelic proclamation that first Christmas night: "Peace on earth, goodwill toward men!" Because of Jesus, that peace and goodwill belongs to you. You enjoy a renewed relationship with God and with others. That is remembered especially during the Advent and Christmas seasons, but it is reality all year long. That's the gift that keeps on giving! I pray that as you experience the light of another Christmas season, your family would find joy not in your purchases, but instead from the assurances that YOU are purchased with the blood of Jesus Christ – a promise of saving beyond all measure.


