You are invited to come on Tuesday evenings as we explore the message of the book of Hebrews.




ND District Convention



Does it really mean something when my pastor forgives my sins?

Have you ever wondered why LCMS pastors pronounce forgiveness of sins with such boldness? Isn't forgiveness something only God can offer? What gives pastors the right?

If we examine the Scriptures, we see Jesus not only gave the disciples the right to forgive sins, but also He gave them His full authority, along with His command, In John 20:21-23, we read: "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any,



they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

In verse 21, the word translated as "sent" means to send as an authorized representative. In other words, the one being sent carries the full authority of the one doing the sending. John 20:21-23 tells us that just as the Father sent Jesus, so too does Jesus send the apostles. The apostles, then, are authorized representatives, standing in the stead of Jesus, and thus, are authorized and commanded to speak God's word of forgiveness

to others. Luther writes: "This is not our forgiveness, but God's forgiveness." Thus through human mediators, God's comforting

words are spoken directly to penitent sinners on behalf of, in the stead of and by the authority of Jesus himself.

The fruits of this forgives are also evident in the passage. In verse 23, the verb translated as "are forgiven" or "are indeed forgiven" are in a tense that indicates present result of past action. This means that when the apostles announce the forgiveness of sins, sins truly are forgiven based on what is said. If the apostles had no authority or command, their words would mean nothing. Yet Jesus assures them: "If you forgive anyone their sins, they are indeed forgiven." This power does not come from the person, but instead from the power of God's word and His promise and command.

That apostles are chosen to carry on the Christ's mission is evidenced by passages such as Matt. 16:19 and Matt. 18:18, along with many others. This becomes especially evident in the Great Commission of Matthew 28, where Jesus states: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations." Here, Jesus broaches the subject of authority not just as a demand (although it certainly is

thus), but instead as an actual passing on of His direct authority to do the work of the kingdom. Of course, this work and authority has been handed down and entrusted to those in the office of the holy ministry. This continues today, a fact evidenced by passages such as Acts 14:23, Titus 1:5, 1 Tim. 3:2 and 2 Tim. 2:2, among others.

So yes, those in the office of the holy ministry not only are able to forgive sins, but also are commanded to forgive sins by Jesus himself, who passes on His authority to forgive sins to human mediators. When pastors speak the absolution, they speak the words with the authority and promise of God himself. This God-given, direct assurance of forgiveness of sins is powerful, bringing sinful believers hope, joy and faith, along with the certainty that God remains active in their lives and still works mightily today among His people.
