Nonetheless, we are witnesses because we have been given the eyewitness accounts about Jesus through the writings of Holy Scripture. We have all been encouraged to testify to these things (2 Timothy 1:8-9). The only question is, "What kind of witnesses will we be?"

I can answer that question very easily. Sometimes we provide a good witness through our words and acts of kindness. At other times, we present a poor witness through our words and actions.

I am so grateful that our heavenly Father continues to show His love to us even when we fail in our mission of witnessing to His goodness with others. This grace of God moves us all the more to want to talk about Him with others. We don't need to live in dread for fear of messing things up. We live in the confidence that God continues to love and care about us and others.

I encourage you to be aware of the fact that you are witnesses for God. I also ask you to show others by your words and actions that we have a loving and caring God. I would love to have people ask others, "Did you see it?" And when they ask, "See what?" they respond by saying, "The love of God shining in them."



The church needs people to take hold of God-given courage



In the Bible, Joshua faced a large task. The Israelites stood on the cusp of entering the promised last after wandering nearly 40 years in the desert. What great expectation and anticipation there must have been! However, their way did not stand unopposed. The Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites and Jebusites already had settled in the land and enjoyed the natural resources and beauty the land provided. Settling would not be easy.

If this were not enough, Israel's long-time leader, Moses, had died. Under God's command, guidance and power, Moses led the people out of Egypt, parted the Red Sea and set the people on course to enter this new land. Moses had gone up on Mt. Sinai to receive the law from God himself. He had seen God's glory from the rear. He had met with God face to face as a man talks with a friend. He wrote the first five books of the Bible!

What a hard act to follow.

It would have been easy for Joshua to fall into self-pity, self-doubt or to second-guess and question God's plan. Joshua could have decided to let someone else take his place of leadership in the assembly. Despite all the negative things on which Joshua could have dwelled, he took solace in God's promises. He remembered how God had brought His people to this point in history. God also helped bolster Joshua's confidence. In Joshua 1:9, God reminds His servant: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified or discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

It is important to know that Joshua also had direction from God, who reminded His servant to carefully consider the book of the law that had recorded God's words. "Meditate on it day and night," God said. "So That you may be careful to do everything written in it," (Joshua 1:8a).

Today, we are much like ancient Israel as we find ourselves in a land filled with different ideas about theology and different ideas about salvation. Even among Christians, wide debate continues regarding major components of doctrine.

That is why the study of God's word remains vital to the church and its identity. We must be prepared to stand against all the influences that seek to twist and distort God's word. At our core, we must be ready to defend the doctrine of Christ crucified for the forgiveness of sins. This salvation comes as a gift that we receive by faith. Therefore, we must sweep aside any other "gospel" that seeks to take hold. We must also be true to God's will for our lives as His people. On one hand, we must defend against current movements that seek to compromise and change those things that God has instituted. For example, defending God's design of marriage and family is becoming increasingly unpopular as divorce and homosexuality become more common. On the other hand, we must defend equally against overzealous traditions and preferences (such as the demand to worship only from a hymnal) that clearly have no root in Scripture or our confessions.

As Christians today, we have a new mandate handed down to us by Jesus in the Great Commission: To go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing and teaching them everything Jesus has commanded us.

As we face a world increasingly hostile to the true Gospel, courage can be in short supply among us. However, our mandate is not to retreat from God's word, but to embrace it and take solace in it. For the very living breathing God goes with us. One rock star commented, "Don't ask God to bless what you are doing; Do the work of God because it is already blessed." Although that is true to some extent, we know the Gospel message can draw ire, rage, disrespect and condemnation. But as God's assurance to Joshua makes clear, courage is not the absence of fear, but rather the conviction that something else is more important than fear.

May God give us courage by remembering the Gospel's vital importance to a broken, dying world.

The ND District LCMS held their 56th convention Jan. 22-25 in Grand Forks. The theme was "Now You are the People of God: Faithful Pastors, Bold Witnesses, Empowered Stewards." 91 voting delegates were present: 43 pastoral and 48 laymen. Rev. Dr. James Baneck was re-elected as district president. Elected as first vice president from the west was Rev. Arie Bertsch and as second vice president from the east was Rev. Clark Jahnke. Circuit Counselors elected were: Rev. David Wagner east; Rev. Scott Ramey—northeast; Rev. Douglas Wanderer—southeast; Rev. Richard Biberdorf—central; Rev. Carlyle Roth northwest; and Rev. Michael Wolters-southwest.

Elected to the board of directors were: Rev. Alan Eppen, secretary; Leon Bladow, treasurer; Rev. Thomas Marcis, Rev. Toby Heller; Mr. Robert Bauer, Mr. Michael Janke, Mr. Robert Drees, Mr. John Riley and Mr. Meryln Mindeman.

Also voted in was the adoption of policy based governance for the ND District.

The delegation also affirmed their desire to work with Minnesota North District in financially supporting the building of three orphanages in Kenya and to reach out to North Dakota's native American population. Also the need to continue to reach out to all North Dakotans in the wake of our recent natural disasters, by prayer and giving of both time and financial support.


Assistant Youth Director Sought
