When the thermometer finally crept up to hit that elusive 50-degree mark, I expected joy and jubilation throughout the valley.

Instead, people reacted with a little bit of contempt. "It's about time!" they said. When predictions came for a week in the 60s, the scoffing came out again: "I'll believe it when I see it!"

When did we become so jaded? Even though spring had officially arrived, it seemed as if some couldn't really enjoy the nice weather because they couldn't quite get past the resentment of living through such a relentless winter.

It is easy to become jaded in our faith as well. Living in a sinful, fallen broken world brings heartaches, pain, disappointment and death. Because of these experiences, our natural inclinations can lead us to question God's promises because these promises seem so long in coming.

As Christians, we still experience pain and suffering, but God has promised these will only last so long for His people. That's because God acted in human history, sending Jesus to descend into this broken world to take all that this sinful world had to give -- its brokenness, wretchedness, its hatred and discord -- shattering their hold through the power of the cross and the empty tomb.

"Reaping What You Sow"

In 2 Corinthians 9:6 (NIV) St. Paul wrote: "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." In many parts of our country during this month of May, gardens will be turning green as new plants spring from the ground and begin the process of producing fruits, vegetables and flowers. If you have ever planted hills of seeds, like cucumbers or beans, you probably know how true these words of St. Paul are. Plant only one or perhaps two seeds in each hill and you will not have the same results that you would have if you had planted four or more seeds in each hill. Of course, St. Paul was not writing about gardening but rather about a special offering to help the saints in Jerusalem and Judea who were suffering from a severe famine. Some may take this passage to mean that it is our motivation for giving. Those folks might even be so bold as to say that if you are stingy in your giving, you will be poorer for it, but if you are generous in your giving you will be even wealthier. But this verse does not state the motivation for giving but simply refers to information and instruction that we know to be true from experience and observation.

The true motivation for Christian giving is found in 2 Corinthians 9:8 (NIV): "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." God's grace in Jesus Christ is the motivation for our Christian giving. Jesus has done for us what we could never do for ourselves, that is, save us from sin, death and everlasting condemnation. Our spiritual needs are fully taken care of in Christ, but what about our physical needs? This passage speaks to that as well when it indicates that God also takes care of our physical needs so that in all things at all times we will have all that we need so that we can abound in every good work.

St. Paul stated this so eloquently in Romans 8:32 (NIV): "He (God) who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all-will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" This question begs for the answer "yes." God does provide all that we need for our spiritual and physical welfare and he does it lavishly so that we can abound in every good work.

Finally, St. Paul brought the truth of Christian giving home when he wrote in 2 Corinthians 9:7 (NIV): "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful (hilarious) giver." Christian giving is primarily a



spiritual issue, not a financial one. When we children of God answer the question of what do I believe God is calling me to give, then we respond freely and generously not because the church or any other Christian cause needs our money, but because we believe in our hearts that our giving is a consecrated response. The joy that we reap from such free and generous giving is something that brings a special sweetness to our lives that no one can ever take away from us.

Living Water

Have you had your fill of talk about water? Beginning in March and then during most of April, we were informed about the possible flooding in the valley. That information (about what the river might do) sent youth from our schools and other volunteers from our community to sandbag central. In other places, clay dikes were erected. People donated their time and abilities to help our community prepare for the big event. However, the flood of 2013 turned out to be not all that major. To be sure, some minor flooding occurred. But nothing close to what they predicted. Personally, I was relieved and delighted that things did not turn out as they once thought. With the danger of major flooding over, can we forget about all this talk of water?

Water is necessary for life here on earth. We don't want too much water on the land for that leads to flooding. But the opposite is also something that we want to avoid. Not having much or any water in the form of precipitation can lead to drought conditions. This was something that large portions of the Midwest experienced last year. Because water is vital to



physical life, we will continue to talk about it. In addition to this, there is another type of water that Jesus speaks about. This is living water, which is vital for our spiritual life. We read from the Gospel of John (7:37-39):

On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him." By this, he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given because Jesus had not yet been glorified.

This passage points out that Jesus is the source of new life, which is described as living water. This new life comes to us through the Holy Spirit, which Jesus, along with God the Father, sends to believers. This new life is possible because Jesus was glorified. In John's Gospel, Jesus' glorification describes His work of salvation for us made possible through his suffering, death and resurrection.

Jesus came to give us new life. As I think about how the river rages through Fargo during the spring floods, I am reminded of the power of the Holy Spirit at work in us who believe. It is like living water. This new life is not a tame or stagnant thing. It is an abundant life to be lived out as we love God and as we love Parter Dave our neighbors. Believe it. Live it.


