## What a difference this child makes!

Word from Pastor Chris



How much does a baby change things? When parents bring an infant home, life no longer resembles the days the family once knew. New dynamics, joys and relationships form as families celebrate this new life. Friends and family rejoice at this precious gift of a child, a joy that Scripture calls "a heritage from the Lord."

How much does a baby change things? Schedules and priorities shift dramatically as the proud mom and dad adjust to feeding schedules, diaper changes and all the attention that a newborn demands. A stark reality has come into play for new parents, who no longer can live for themselves; the more they do, the more the welfare of the child can become compromised.

But what a difference a child makes! What hopes and dreams and joys come with them!

Now imagine this experience if you knew your child would be God's son, the promised Messiah and King. That's what happened to Mary, the mother of our Lord, when the angel told her: "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus (Yahweh is salvation).

He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of His father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom, there will be no end," Luke 1:31-33.


How much does a new baby change things? This baby changed everything! Not for just Mary, but for the entire world. Here, in this Christ child, come not just hopes and dreams, but the fulfillment and wonder of God's loving plan wrapped in swaddling clothes with 10 tiny fingers and 10 tiny toes.

Yet even early on, the cross looms over the young child and His family.

Not even seven weeks into His life, as Joseph and Mary bring the young babe to the temple,

the parents are told: "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel and for a sign that is opposed."

What does this mean? Life no longer resembles the days we once knew. This Christ child, born into an earthly family yet from heavenly origins, has



That's guite a change! But this change would not be without sacrifice.

Mary herself receives dire news at the temple 40 days into the life of her baby boy: "and a sword will piece your soul also."

This child would be opposed. He would be despised, rejected, humiliated, and slain, giving His life for the sins of the whole world on the cross and rising to life again in victory and power. Mary would not protect her Son from the sins of mankind nor the wrath of God, but this child whom Mary once delivered would deliver her and all those who believe. Here was not just a messiah, but God himself, graciously given as a heritage from the Lord, offering the forgiveness of sins through the blood of His son.

As we celebrate Advent, Christmas and our new life in Christ, we remember it is born from Jesus coming to us in human flesh. What a difference this child – God's Son, our Lord – makes not just for our life now, but into eternity!

## How Fortunate! Word from Pastor Dave



I use the word "fortunate" to often denote receiving some unexpected good or escaping some expected evil. For me, the term is similar to being lucky, but also it conveys something more. One is fortunate to be able to walk away from a vehicle accident without any injuries. One is fortunate to come upon some unexpected money. As I think about it, being fortunate often seems to be just a matter of chance. But is that true?

In the Gospel of Luke, we read that Mary visited Elizabeth after she was told by the angel that she would give birth to the Savior. As Mary greeted Elizabeth, there was a humble and faith-filled response that came from Elizabeth. She was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed in a loud voice, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43) One of the things her words declare is how fortunate she felt just to be with Jesus and Mary. She realized that she did not deserve this honor. Nevertheless, she received something special because of Jesus.

The question is, "Do we see ourselves also as being favored and fortunate because of Jesus?"

As we observe the season of Advent in December, the Scripture lessons will remind us of just who we are. On the one hand, we are people who by ourselves are without a prayer, without a future and without peace because of our sinfulness before God. But on the other hand, we are people to whom God drew near. The Lord's coming at His birth reminds us that some more than unexpected good came our way. Jesus came to change our fortune. He did it not by giving us silver and gold, but by living, dying and rising again for us.

Fortunate was Elizabeth, fortunate are we and fortunate are all who trust God's mercy in Christ. The good we have received from God through His Son cannot be measured. It is a gift to be treasured. It is also a gift to be shared so that others too may find themselves to be so favored before God because of the presence of Christ in their lives.

I have no idea what gifts you may receive this Christmas. But be assured that in Christ you have the greatest gift of all — how fortunate!

We invite all of our members to attend our December congregational meeting. We plan to adopt the budget for the next year that deals with our regular expenses associated with ministry. Besides passing a budget, the Church Council also will be putting forth a proposal that our congregation addresses other issues. These things were discussed during our fall stewardship meetings. Because not everyone was able to attend one of those gatherings, we will share some of our discussion here.

Our congregation is blessed to have a wonderful facility. As with any building, however, there are issues that relate to upkeep and maintenance. For Beautiful Savior, these items are:

- ◆ The roof over the fellowship needs to be replaced. It leaks.
- The heating unit for the fellowship hall is more than 30 years old.
- The carpet in our lobby or narthex should be replaced.
- We would like to upgrade the bathrooms by putting tile on the floors.
- There are also some other smaller items that we would like to accomplish. They include painting the bottom of the bell tower and raising some extra money to support the Sudanese seminary students.




