### Direction and Power for the New Year Word from Pastor Dave

My family observed various traditions while I was growing up. One of them was celebrating New Year's Eve with our relatives at the home of Uncle Earl and Aunt Elizabeth. We would play games as we awaited the start of a new year.



Because they had a pool table, we would pass the time playing various games on it. I never became a master at the pool table. As I played the game, sometimes the balls went where I wanted them to go—powered often by a strong hit on the cue ball. At other times, my aim was horrible even though it didn't seem that way when I hit the balls. This is what made the game fun and frustrating to play. Whether you have played pool or not, we have all experienced times in life when things go smoothly and times when things bounce all over the place.

As we begin a new year, it is common for people to try to start over or branch out in a new direction in their life. How well that is achieved for many can be measured often by the fact that every year they seek to start anew.

# Moving Forward with a Capital Campaign

At our December voters' meeting, the congregation agreed to move forward with a capital campaign to raise money for some special needs. Our congregation has a wonderful facility. As with any building, however, there are upkeep and maintenance issues. To address the needs, we will be sending out a special fund appeal this year to cover the cost of these items:



- The roof over the fellowship hall needs to be reshingled.
- The heating unit for the fellowship hall is more than 30 years old. A new one will be needed soon before this one breaks down.
- The carpet in our lobby, hallways and in the fellowship hall needs to be replaced.
- The bathrooms need to be upgraded with new tile on the floors.
- There are also some other smaller items that will be included in this campaign. They involve painting a portion of the bell tower and raising some extra funds to support the Sudanese seminary students.

The total cost for this will be around \$100,000. More information will be coming out about this in a month. We encourage you to pray and think about how you might give above what you are presently giving so that these needs can be met.

The success rate of having everything go as you like would be about as good as how often the balls on the pool table went where I wanted them to go. That can be frustrating. But as we look at our God, we have encouragement even in times when life seems to be out of control. This hope is grounded in the person and work of God.

Because God is our creator and redeemer, He encourages us to see every day as a new beginning—and it truly is. God's mercy comes to us every day. Each day, we have the opportunity in minor or major ways to start anew. The Biblical way of describing this is to speak about daily repentance. But one thing Christians often forget (and I am guilty of this many times over) is the power that God supplies to us through the Holy Spirit and the direction that God gives us in His Word.

St. Paul urged the early Christians with these words in Galatians (5:16), "Live by the Spirit and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature." With these words, Paul reminds us of the power we have through the Spirit to live a good life. With these words, Paul also gives us



a warning not to let the ungodly and harmful desires within us be what gives direction in our lives. God calls us to live wisely. This means paying attention to His Word and relying on the Spirit for daily strength.

God's Word helps us see what is valuable in life and what values we are to live by. We live life in vain if it is without purpose, values and direction. When we lose touch with our values, we often find ourselves at the mercy of every seduction, every enticement, every claim on our money, our energy and our time. To experience life like that is similar to bouncing all over the place in life. Something very similar to how the balls reacted when I played pool. But that doesn't need to happen as we look to God for direction and rely in the Holy Spirit to power us in our daily lives.

As we begin a new year. I pray that it will go well with you and your family. But above all, I pray that your journey this year would be one of great blessings given and received by you as the Holy Spirit guides and moves you through daily repentance.

To accommodate services at St. John on Sunday mornings, this will have some bearing on our second worship service. On Sunday mornings starting in January, both pastors will be at our first worship service and




will lead their Sunday morning Bible studies. But by 10:15 a.m. one of the pastors will travel up to Hillsboro to conduct worship there.
