Defending Our Faith

Word from Pastor Chris

In this day and age, people make all kinds of claims without checking the facts. Instead of actually addressing the issue and doing some digging, people often voraciously defend their worldview without any effort to discover the truth.

For example, a friend of mine once told me that Jesus never claimed to be God. "There's nowhere in the Bible to even support this idea," he said. "Christians mistakenly came to view Jesus as God later on in history."

What would you say to this? How would you respond? As faith comes under attack time and again, how will you stand under the assault?

A simple glance into the Bible reveals my friend was wrong. In John 8, Jesus explains to some of the Jews that even though they could



trace their lineage as descendants of Abraham, they still had a severe sin problem. Jesus explains that the faith of Abraham looked forward to the coming of a messiah.

"Your Father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day," Jesus said. "He saw it and was glad."

So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet 50 years old and have you seen Abraham?"

Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." (Continued on page 2.)

When God called Moses through the burning bush to lead His people out of Israel, God revealed His personal name as Yahweh, meaning "I am." Jesus now makes reference to this name, rightfully claiming it as His own.

Throughout the ages, God has pointed people toward his word as an infallible reminder of who God is, what he is doing and how he makes himself known among people. There are numerous other passages that allude to Christ's divinity. Could you make an argument to discuss what they might be?

Buddha never claimed to be God. Moses never claimed to be Yahweh. Mohammed never claimed to be Allah. Yet Jesus Christ claimed to be the true and living God. Buddha simply said, "I am a teacher in search of the truth." Jesus said, "I am the Truth." Confucius said, "I never claimed to be holy." Jesus said, "Who convicts me of sin?" Mohammed said, "Unless God throws his cloak of mercy over me, I have no hope." Jesus said, "Unless you believe in me, you will die in your sins."

On April 12 and 19, our Sunday Bible study will explore "Defending your faith: The case for a resurrected Christ." Through the power of the Holy Spirit, our study will lay the groundwork for both believing and defending the fact that Christians did not make a mistake thinking Jesus was God. They lived and died with the glorious news that God had come in the flesh to save mankind and restore creation.

Join us in learning to make a case to those who think Jesus is just a myth or invention of history.

There are joys in life. It is something that we all have experienced. These joys come from a variety of things that are important to us. Joy comes as we see our children do well at school, music, theater or sports. It swells in us as our college or professional teams make the playoffs. Joy comes as we visit with friends or take a vacation. We recently had news that brought great joy to my wife and me when we heard about the birth of a new grandson to our son Lucas and his wife in March. Our grandson Milo is doing well and we are going to go visit them in the middle of April. This will also bring us gladness.

Much of the joy that we have in life, however, is temporary. We are glad that our team makes the playoffs. But when they lose, we are disappointed. We may be glad to go on a vacation. But by the end of it, we may not be able to get home fast enough. Our children and grandchildren bring us much joy, but they can also cause heartache. Nevertheless, there is a joy that we have that can never be taken away.

Right before Jesus died, he said to his disciples, "Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy," (John 16:22). Christ is speaking here about his suffering, death and resurrection. The disciples will experience dreadful anxiety and grief. But with the resurrection of Jesus, that will change to joy, and that joy will never go away.

On the first Sunday of April, we will celebrate Easter—the day that Jesus rose from the grave. That event has changed the course of history. His resurrection puts things into a whole new perspective. By Christ rising from the dead, we realize that God has much more in store for us and that this life is not all that there is. This impacts how we view not only eternity but also this life.

If there were no resurrection, it would be easy to become super selfish in this life. If this world is all that there is, then we might feel that we need to experience as much as we can now. Forget about others. Focus on yourself, and grab what you can while you live. But life was never meant to be lived centered around yourself. The world is not to revolve around us. This is idolatry for we make ourselves our own gods. Jesus summarized God's will for us with the two commandments that we love God with all our heart, soul and mind and that we love our neighbors as ourselves. There is no hope of joy if our lives depended on fulfilling God's will. As St. Paul reminds us, we fall short—completely short—of the glory of God.

I am so glad that God did not just think about Himself. He looked upon you, me and all of humankind with compassion. That compassion moved Him to send His Son into this world as our Savior. This Savior rescues us not only from death and the devil. Jesus rescues us from ourselves and our self-centeredness. It is because of His life and death for us that we can have joy knowing that God's wrath has been taken away and that we know we have peace and a blessed future with our own resurrection from the dead.



I pray that the work Jesus did through His life, death and resurrection may bring you hope, peace and JOY.

"For You make me glad by Your deeds, O Lord; I sing for joy at the works of Your hands." (Psalm 92:4)




Save Labels and Box Tops
