I was in Mandan, but my wife was in Fargo. Yet it was so easy to tell her I missed her. I just picked up my phone and sent some texts.

Although we may spend time away from family, staying connected has become much easier, thanks to advances in technology. Of course, that does not compare with actually being there with loved ones and sharing treasured moments as we experience life together. But e-mail, texting and video conferencing allows us to interact with loved ones, even though they may be many miles away.

For people of faith, staying connected to God is a bit different. We can't e-mail, text or video conference with God. Yet God does not need technology to connect with His people. Instead, through His almighty power and mercy, he connects to us through Word and sacrament.

In our baptism, God connects us to himself. He clothes us with Christ, giving us a new identity. He adopts us as His own child. He gives us the gifts of forgiveness and the Holy Spirit. In our baptism, God comes to us directly.

In the Lord's Supper, God gives us the very body and blood of Jesus for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. Through the Lord's Supper, God comes to us directly. Through His word, God demonstrates His great love for us. Through this Holy Word, the Father and Son send the Holy Spirit to open our minds and hearts to receive God's love and to remind us of what He has promised, what He has done and to renew and lead us in His ways. Through His Word, God comes to us directly.

Although at times, he may seem far away, God is never far from us. Although we live by faith and not by sight, God still deems to pour out His presence right where we are. What great gifts God has bestowed upon us in Word and Sacrament, also called the means of grace.

As we enter into a new church year, remembering Christ's coming as a human babe to suffer, die and rise for us, and as we anticipate His return, we also remember He is with us through the means of grace.
