2016 begins the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, and one of the great cries of the Reformation was *sola fide*, by faith alone! Pastor Charles Blanco will be our guest to speak on the act of believing as we see it portrayed in the Scriptures. He will lead us in an examination of how the New Testament authors depicted trust and belief in the Triune God. We will investigate the "ins and outs" of believing and how believing is at the same time so very simple. "*For the Gospel is the power of salvation to all who believe,*" Rom. 1:16 Also how believing is very much in need of divine aid every step of the way. "*Lord, I believe-help my unbelief!*" Mark 9:24.

Charles Blanco is associate professor of Theology at Concordia University, NE, where he also directs the pre-seminary program. Prior to teaching at Concordia, he served in the Rocky Mountain District as pastor of Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church in Ft. Lupton, Colorado (1984-2002). He is a graduate of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis (1983) and Concordia Teachers College, River Forest (1979).

## Faithful Christians DO Attend Church

The other day, I heard a comment that one does not have to go to church to be a faithful Christian. In fact, the argument went, some of “the most faithful” Christians do not attend church.

Wait. What? Insisting that your ways are better than God’s ways is being most faithful? Hardly.

Of course, faith trusts in Christ alone for our salvation. But in the gathering of God’s people in worship, God gives us exactly that: faith in Christ. “So faith comes from hearing, and hearing from the Word of Christ, (Rom. 10:17). We do well to remember that although our salvation does not depend on church attendance, our church attendance brings us to the place where God has promised to tend to our salvation. It’s where God continues to connect us to Jesus.

Because the Holy Spirit guides us in the ways of the Lord, the Spirit would guide us faithfully to receive God’s word as the truth and norm of life. God’s Word calls us to remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy. Specifically, the command calls God’s people to gather together to hear the preaching and teaching of His Word. Both the Old and New Testaments testify to the importance of corporate worship and coming together as an assembly of God’s people.

So let’s call a spade a spade. Neglecting to set aside time to worship, learn and receive God’s gifts is not being faithful. In fact, it’s being sinful; it goes against God’s design. It is living according to the flesh, not in the Spirit. For this, we must not continue in this practice so that grace may abound but instead repent! As Paul reminds us, “How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life,” (Rom. 6:2b-4).

Of course, some people spend their time in church fulfilling the letter of the law, but not the spirit of the law. In other words, they go through the motions but fail in drawing close to God and receive His Word and Sacraments with joy and thanksgiving. But where

we fail God, He does not fail us. The most important part of worship is that our Lord has promised to meet us so that he might bless us with His gifts. It is where He has promised to be Immanuel, God with us. God on our heads in the waters of holy Baptism. God in our ears in preaching and teaching. God with us on our mouths in the body and blood of Christ in and through the bread and wine. And through these, God in our hearts and minds through faith.

We spend most of our week inundated by the world’s claim of truth. And our fallen sinful natures buy right into it. God commands us to worship (and invites us to do this) because through preaching and teaching, God gives us His truth, which is THE truth.

We spend a lot of our week sinning against God in thought, word and deed. Coming to church allows us to confess before God and each other our sinful thoughts, words and deeds; it is an act of repentance followed by the assurance and proclamation of sins forgiven for Christ’s sake.

Jesus commanded us to baptize and teach. Implicit in this is not only the giving of these gifts but the receiving of them. Through His Sacrament and Word, God gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit for the strengthening of our faith. The Holy Spirit even produces the fruits of faith, namely, the impulses to follow God’s wills and ways – even in our great weakness.

It seems to me a faithful Christian would not stay away from God’s blessings but instead be eager to receive the Lord’s gifts — and even the Lord himself – as often as possible in public worship.

As we enter into a new year and the season of Epiphany, “Grant us grace to see Thee, Lord, present in Thy holy Word; grace to imitate Thee now and be pure as pure art Thou. That we may become like Thee at Thy great epiphany. And may praise Thee ever blest. God in man made manifest,” (LSB 394, verse five).
