As I sat in my office one morning in January, I paused to enjoy the chirping of a bird for a few minutes. It had already been singing about 15 minutes outside my window when I thought I might as well listen to what it wanted to communicate. It was a beautiful winter day. There was very little wind, and the sun was shining at that moment. The temperature was in the mid-twenties. If I had to live

outdoors, I might have been singing a joyful song that morning as well. I have no idea what was

going through the mind of the bird that morning. But I conjectured that life for that bird was good at that time. As the bird sang, it was making that known. This moved me to think about what was going on in my own life and how I respond to what is happening.

A Reality Beyond Our Mortal Vision: Psalms And The Touch Of Grace

The title: A Reality Beyond Our Mortal Vision: Psalms And The Touch of Grace relies on the assumption that there are two registers of existence. The world you see with your mortal eyes, where hard work will "get you places." And the other world, the one you cannot see, where God, who controls all things, dwells. Where your work doesn't matter. Job found that out the hard way. God's favor does not depend on anything you do.

So, on this assumption, grace is--in a sense--terrifying because you can't control it. It comes to you. You are touched by it ...or not. You can't see it--at least not yet. But there are those who are sure they have it. Paul, for one, was sure he and his addressees had it. He wrote: "[God] hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began." The poets in this series also knew God's touch. They knew God's grace. And it haunts their words. By listening to them, we learn of it, and through their words we might even be touched with it ourselves.

Often, because of my schedule, it seems like it is only in the evening that I am able to pause for a while, rest and reflect on the day. Before we go to bed, my wife, Kim, and I will often comment to each other about how it was a good day. But as I thought about how that bird was chirping away early in the morning, I was reminded about how we can reflect on the goodness of God throughout the day.

When Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount, he encouraged us to "look at the birds of the air" (Matt. 6:26). He urged His followers to pause from time to time and consider how our Creator provides for us. This is to bring us peace so we do not act like others who do not know God. It also gives us the opportunity to focus on even more important things. In that sermon, Jesus also went on to say that because God is watching over us, we can focus on even more vital things. Christ put it this way, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be added to you" (Matthew 6:33).

The kingdom of God and his righteousness refers to God's gracious rule over us in the person of His Son and the salvation that Jesus bestows upon us because of His death and resurrection on our behalf. If a bird had reason to sing because it was a beautiful winter morning, I believe we have 10,000 more reasons to sing each day because of the beautiful and gracious things that God does for us through creation and through Christ.

Stop, take time to think about the good things that God brings to you each and every day.

Embrace Jesus, Not Worldly Items

The majesty of St. Louis Cathedral stands as the backdrop of Jackson Square, an iconic public landmark and the Gateway to the French Quarter in New Orleans.

With the sacred and the secular in such close quarters, this juxtaposition brings with it certain jarring realities. Psychics, Taro

card readers and palmists lined the plaza immediately outside of the

Cathedral's doors facing Jackson Square, inviting people to engage in activities that undermine faith right outside a house of faith. Not content in the Lord's plans to bless you in this world and the next through Jesus Christ our Lord? Then seek your comfort elsewhere.

Such is our battle. In our hearts, Idols always stand outside the door. So many things vie for our attention and our allegiance. So many thing affect our attitudes, behaviors, hearts and minds. So many things take the place of God, who is the ultimate comfort.

In Matthew 16:15, Jesus asks the disciples: "Who do you say that I am?" After all, many opinions had been forming. In answer to Jesus' question, Peter responds not with an opinion, but with the truth of God that had been revealed to him by the power of God:

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!"

So much is packed into this statement! Peter had

confessed that Jesus was the anointed one that God had set apart to usher in salvation. Peter's confession receives Jesus as part of the Godhead. Most of all, Peter's confession sees in Jesus the one true God, active in human history bringing life to all.

Peter's confession is quite a statement. Is that your confession? Many times, we are content to see Jesus as an option or a safety net – something way in the backdrop while we attend to "our life."

But all the idols that we think place comfort and true meaning in our lives and give shape to who we are cannot give us life. Only the living God working in Jesus Christ can do that.

I had an impulse to overturn the tables outside of St. Louis Cathedral. A zeal for the Lord's house had consumed me and touched me in the sacred space within that Cathedral. But perhaps a better solution has presented itself, one that will require God's aid and providence. The solution is receiving God's gifts of Word and Sacrament, which through the power of the Holy Spirit, reminds us that in view of eternity, idols always lead to a dead end.

But Christ finds us in all our dead ends. He comes to us with arms wide open, empowering and imploring us to embrace Peter's confession of our Lord and to receive our Lord himself. It is Jesus who is our hope and our life, our Lord and our God. It is Jesus who is the subject and object of our faith – the person in whom we have the forgiveness of sins and God's all-encompassing favor and love.

Addison (age 14, diagnosed 9/2005) & Clay (age 10, diagnosed 3/2011) both have Limb Girdle Muscular Dystrophy 2I (LGMD2I) which is a progressive muscle weakening disease affecting the voluntary muscles, mainly around the shoulders and hips and the muscles connected to those that are closest to the center of the body, resulting in the inability to raise your arms and legs and to walk. The only involuntary muscle affected is the heart and at this time there is no cure or way to slow the progression of the disease.

As these muscles have weakened and Addison has lost her ability to walk & solely depends on her power wheelchair for mobility. At this time Clay uses a manual wheelchair for long distances. The weakening muscles are no longer able to support Addison's spine causing her to develop neuromuscular scoliosis resulting in reduced pulmonary function and pain in her back. Addison is having her spine fused in January at the U of M Children's Hospital in Minneapolis to reduce the pain, improve her breathing and give her better quality of life.

All proceeds from this fundraiser will go to the Fell family to help with current and ongoing medical expenses.
