
After Jesus' resurrection and the sending of the Holy Spirit, it is obvious that many people could not get enough of Jesus. Because Jesus ascended into the heavens after his resurrection, you were not able to see him. The next best thing was to hear the apostles talk about the words and acts of Christ. They gathered for worship where they were able to hear the words of the apostles and respond with their praises to what God had done for them. They gathered to pray for one another and encourage one another in their daily lives. Their actions impacted others who then came to believe in Jesus.

I would like you to stop and think for awhile. Think about not only how the death and resurrection of Jesus impacts your life but also how you live. We just celebrated what I considered to be the greatest event in the church calendar: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. There were many people who joined in these special worship services. These are truly great days for all Christians to celebrate. However, our commemoration of Christ's victory for us is not to be narrowed down to just some special days throughout the year—such as at Christmas and Easter. In the book of Acts, we see how people would daily meet and celebrate Jesus. Because daily get-togethers cannot always happen, the first Christians would meet every Sunday to worship. Each Sunday was a mini-Easter celebration. This continues on with us today.

We have worship services every Sunday. We do this because we also rejoice in the victory that Christ won for us through His death and resurrection. We also gather because this is God's will for us. Through worship we are strengthened and taught in our Christian faith so that as we go out into the world we may be better equipped to serve God and others. In other words, the life-changing event of Christ death and resurrection continues to change how we live out our lives in our families, at school, at work and in our community.

I pray that the joy of Easter would be with you every day of the year. I encourage you to continue the celebration by worshipping each week. I also urge you to live your daily lives as one whose life is constantly changing towards loving God and others more.

9:40 a.m. Sundays



Evolution remains one of the greatest influences in moving people away from the Christian faith. But was Darwin right? What if he took his theory too far? What if a kernel of truth has popped into a gross misunderstanding?

Darwinian evolution does not simply cling to concrete facts. Much of the theory finds its basis in interpretation of data that is unobservable and unprovable. In other words, science often misappropriates personal interpretation and presents it as hard evidence.

While the church acknowledges God's power in providing enough genetic information to help "kinds" adapt to their environment (micro-evolution), we staunchly reject any idea of one kind transforming into another (macro-evolution). Some Christians have adopted this view of evolution, dismissing God's creative activity. Such belief undermines the authority of the Scriptures, the attributes of God and even faith itself. This is an important issue that should not be ignored!

During the month of April, Dr. Terry Mortenson from Answers in Genesis will provide evidence that true science points to intelligent and purposeful design – fingerprints of a wise and powerful creator.

Mortenson will be in the Fargo area to speak on many topics that will help to expose and uncover the fallacies of widely held scientific misinterpretation. Please take time along with your family to learn, grow and appreciate the truth of God's Word on the following subjects:

## AED Training 9:40 a.m. on Sunday, April 24

Recently Beautiful Savior purchased an AED, that is, an automated external defibrillator. This is a computerized medical device that can check a person's heart rhythm. It can recognize a rhythm that requires a shock. And it can advise the rescuer when a shock is needed. The AED uses voice prompts, lights and text messages to tell the rescuer the steps to take. On April 24, LeAnn Herrmann will introduce us to this device and explain how to use it. We encourage everyone to attend this training between worship services on Sunday morning.
