


Vacation Bible School: "Cave Quest"

Measuring our Faith

Looks like Fitbit may be just a bit off perfectly fit.

A recent news article called into question the accuracy of Fitbit heart rate trackers. According to the report, the popular device may miscalculate heart rates by up to 20 percent (on average) during more intensive workouts. Other studies have revealed similar flaws.

This still must play out in court, and the jury is still out. But it calls to mind a more theological question: When we try to measure the strength of our faith and how we "are doing" in regards to our standing before God, out internal trackers based on works cannot report any degree of accuracy. Our barometers of faith fitness cannot always be trusted.

I recently heard a troubling accusation that many LCMS churches don't practice what they preach. They don't live their faith. It sounded like if a local church did not have a soup kitchen or a track record of mission trips or a zeal for social justice that somehow their faith was lesser and lackluster.

This was the exact thinking of the Pharisees, and Jesus condemned them for it! I do not condemn committing ourselves to acts of mercy and helping our neighbor. That certainly flows from the Gospel. But when we start making comparisons and look down on one another, that becomes a danger of the gravest kind. When we start to take pride in our deeds as a measure of our faith, then faith truly has been compromised. Jesus makes that clear as recorded in Luke 18:9-14:

"(Jesus) also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt:

'Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: "God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get." But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

So what does living our faith really mean? Living our faith means God has moved us to repent for the depths of depravity and self-centeredness and pride our hearts produce. Living our faith means the Holy Spirit helps us call to mind who "went to His house justified" and why. Living our faith means God has given us trust in Christ alone for our righteousness. And living our faith means good works flowing from the Gospel.

Any other measure is not fit. Not one bit.
