I am speaking here about our growth as God's children and God working in us to bear more fruit. Once we come to faith, we are saved. There is nothing that we can do to contribute to our forgiveness or eternal life in heaven. We are not living yet in the world to come. As long as we live here on this earth, God is in the process of remodeling us so that we may more boldly declare His praises and better serve others. St. Peter puts in this way in his first letter (1 Peter 2:4-5):

"As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him—you also, like living stones are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."

This passages states that we are "being built." This refers to God working in our lives. It also describes us as living stones and a holy priesthood. This means we are to reflect the holiness and love of God. Through our words and actions, we show others just how majestic and gracious is the Lord God. Being incorporated into God's house and family, we allow God to remodel us so that our lives may better demonstrate love to others.

I mentioned earlier that remodeling can be a messy thing. The old needs to be removed and replaced with the new. That also happens in our life. Our self-centered thoughts, words and actions are not to remain a part of us. Through repentance and forgiveness, God removes the old self with its self-centeredness and replaces it with a new self that is to reflect the image of God. Because we will never be free of our sinful nature in this life, this remodeling project is continuous throughout our life. There is no need to become discouraged. God is more than up for this task. He is willing and through His Spirit capable of doing what needs to be done. St. Paul expresses confidence as he writes in Philippians (1:6):

"being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

The Lord God sent His Son into this world so that things could be made new. Before He began His public ministry, Jesus worked as a skilled carpenter. I like to think that God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are in the business of building things.

I encourage to check up on the progress that is happening with our remodeling project at the church building this summer. I also pray that you would continue to allow God to mold and shape you. I encourage you to let the Holy Spirit continue to remodel you so that you may display the grace of God to others.


Loose Change" Sunday July 31

Critical of Critics by Pastor Chris

I have no use for critics.

Not the kind you encounter in daily life, mind, you. I'm talking about the kind who make their living writing for magazines, newspapers and other assorted media.

I recently took our kids to see one of the summer's anticipated blockbusters in the movie theater. We saw the film in eye-popping 3-D, a rare treat for us. After the movie ended, we all responded approvingly, giving the film six thumbs way up (That's two thumbs up from three of us.)

Anxious to see what the critics thought, I fired up the computer. They received the movie much differently than I did. It seems these days that the movies I enjoy and the ones the critics recommend are never the same movies.


And I'm not the only one. Checking on IMDB, many films garnered an 80 percent approval rating from moviegoers only to be snubbed by the critics.

Yet even though I am full aware of this discrepancy, I still allow critical accolades or blasting too woo my decision to see a film. When will I learn?

I think many of us allow outside voices to influence our view of God's Word. We let the outside world shape and mold our opinions, not always confident that God has given us His Word as a gift to help us discover truth in reality, truth in salvation, truth in living and truth in general. Only God remains unaffected by sin, corruption and falsehood. The rest of us cannot make that claim.

So I must insist that we boycott the critics calling us to alter or even forget God's Word. One of my favorite Bible passages sums it up best:

"Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and he will make straight your paths," (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Harrison Re-elected LCMS President

The Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, having received 56.96 percent of the votes cast, is the president-elect of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod for a third term of office, 2016–2019.

The nomination process for the position of Synod president began last fall with the mailing of nominations ballots to all congregations of the Synod. All nominations were required to be submitted by Feb. 9, 2016, or five months prior to the start of the Synod convention, when the ballots, received by an outside auditor, were tallied and delivered to the Secretary of the Synod.

The resulting candidates for the office of president were the three ordained ministers who received the highest number of votes in the nominations process and who consented to serve if elected. The three nominees for president of Synod were Harrison, the Rev. Dr. David P.E. Maier and the Rev. Dr. Dale A. Meyer.

The voters in the president's election were the congregations' delegates that were in attendance at the 2015 district convention.

The results of the ballot tallied and reported to the Secretary of the Synod by Election-America are as follows:

Harrison was voted president-elect with 3,507 votes (56.96 percent); Meyer received 2,257 votes (36.66 percent); and Maier received 393 votes (6.38 percent).

We pray that God would continue to lead, guide and bless the work of our re-elected president.

Thrivent Financial Night at the RedHawks


