During the past month of November, we were reminded that Jesus is the Light of the world. In December we will again celebrate God's Light coming into the world with the birth of Jesus. With the coming of Jesus, our lives have been changed. In John's first letter, he writes,

"But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."

In this passage, we hear about light, fellowship and cleaning up. But it doesn't point us to our actions. Rather, this verse points to what God has done for us. God is light. Through faith in Jesus, we have been brought into the light. And just as the Christmas lights in our homes help us see and bring joy and a certain ambiance into our lives, so also does our Savior enlighten our lives so that we can have gladness not only during this month but throughout our lives.

In this life, we develop close relationships with others. At times, these relationships may become strained. Parents and children as well as brothers and sisters do not always get along. But with Christ, things are different. We can have fellowship with one another even if things do not always go smoothly because Jesus enables us to have peace. Through Christ, we have fellowship with God. It is also because of Christ that we can have a closer relationship with those around us. How is this possible? It is because Jesus cleans things up.

I mentioned that my wife, Kim, and I will do cleaning up in our home. But our cleaning up is nothing compared to what Jesus was able to do for us. It was not with soap and water that he made things fresh. Rather, it was through His blood that He cleansed us so that we are spotless before God. Having been forgiven by God, we strive to forgive others. This is something that contributes to have a better relationship with others because we don't allow the past hurts to dirty our fellowship with others. We forgive others and ask them to forgive us so that there may be nothing between us.

December is a special time with beautiful decorations and activities that brighten up life. It is also a busy time for many. But I urge you to take some time to contemplate at home and during our special worship services the light, hope and joy that Jesus brings to you through His actions. I also pray that God would bring you gladness no matter what circumstances surround your life.



God Doesn't let You Down

There may be times when it feels like it is you against the world – moments when it seems your family, your friends and even God let you down.

If you feel like that, Advent and Christmas are a perfect time to remember that God sent Jesus to live through the complete human experience. Jesus would be the human who would not let Father down while also being God in the flesh and the fulfillment of a promised one who would not let us down.

But it was not an easy road for Jesus. In fact, it was a dark and lonely one.

He faced the temptations of the devil and His legions of demons.

His own family struggled to remember his purpose.

His own people rejected him and sought to kill him – even as he sought to save them. His closest friends and followers deserted him; they were slow to believe all that Jesus had taught and that the scriptures had taught. Isaiah puts it this way: "He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not," (Isaiah 53:3).



He took upon himself the full wrath of the Father on the cross. He even felt the pangs of death. In fact, Isaiah also tells us: "Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief," (Isaiah 53:10a).

Through it all, Jesus remained resolute. He stayed faithful to His father and never waivered in His love for you. And when he rose, he demonstrated the

wisdom of God's plan, the depths of God's love and the power of God's salvation. Isaiah writes, "But he was pierced for our transgressions;

he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed," and "Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one.



You have a Savior who came through! You have a God who did not let you down! I pray that Christmas and Advent would be a time of hope and joy as you remember what Jesus did and continues to do for you.

A Sudanese community continues to worship on Sunday afternoons at Beautiful Savior under the care of Vicar Daniel Mapur and Vicar Samuel Majak. Our pastors are mentoring these seminarians as well as helping them with their studies. Pastor Dave recently wrote:

"Through my interactions with the Sudanese - particularly working with Vicar Daniel and Vicar Samuel - I have grown spiritually. I believe that God brought them to our congregation so that great things could happen. In fact, great things have happened in my life. I have a better appreciation of what it means to be a member of the church of Christ that is made up of people from all nations, languages and ethnic backgrounds. I also have been humbled. I recognize that I have had a good life. I thank God for that every day. Yet, as I visit with many of the Sudanese, I am amazed at how God has given them strength and joy in spite of the unbelievable hardships that they encountered in Africa and in spite of the struggles that they continue to have here in the US. I wonder if my faith and joy would be like theirs if I went through similar circumstances. Yes, I am humbled. But I also am blessed to be able to call them my friends, my brothers and sisters in Christ. I am grateful for the support that

Vicar Daniel Mapur and Samuel Majak have completed 13 of the 16 courses that they need to complete their courses at the seminary. It is a four-year process. At the end of their studies, they will need to go through a interview process to complete their certification. Upon approval, they will be able to be called as pastors of specialized ministry in the LCMS. That means they will be looking for a congregation to call them so that they would be able to continue working with Sudanese who have come to the USA along with other African immigrants. At this time Daniel and Samuel would like to continue to live in the Fargo area and serve God here at Beautiful Savior.

In the next few months, the Sudanese community that worships here, along with our congregation, will be looking at their ministry. Nothing has been decided at this time. However, a good option would be that, upon approval from the Sudanese worshipping community at Beautiful Savior, our congregation would extend calls to Vicar Daniel and Vicar Samuel upon their successful completion of their pastoral certification. That would mean that they would be pastors here along with Pastor Dave and Pastor Chris. We will keep our congregation informed during this process.
