Sudanese Ministry at Beautiful Savior by Pastor Dave

Mission work and ministry to people of different cultures and languages does not only happen in other places around the world. It has been happening at Beautiful Savior for some time. Seven years ago, some Sudanese Christians were drawn to our church denomination because of our doctrine and practice. They approached Pastor Dave and asked if they could use our building to conduct worship services in their native language. After approval by the Church Council and the voters, they began to worship on Sunday afternoons in September 2010. Pastor Dave and Pastor Chris worked with these new Americans. As a result of that, Daniel and Samuel enrolled in our Synodical program in 2013 to become pastors of specialized ministries in the LCMS. They were called by our congregation to serve as vicars to the Sudanese community in 2014.

Daniel and Samuel will complete their studies in August. After they have completed their classes and an interview process, they can be ordained if they have a call from a congregation. At our voters' meeting on March 5,

the Board of Elders and the Church Council will recommend that we call vicars Daniel Mapur and Samuel Majak as pastors to the Sudanese congregation at Beautiful Savior.

If our congregation calls Daniel and Samuel, they would be pastors of specialized ministries to new Americans from Africa. This means that their situation would be different from the that of Pastor Dave and Pastor Chris. They will continue to have full-time jobs that provide them with salary and health insurance. Their calls will be to serve the Sudanese by:


- Leading the Sudanese worship services
- Providing pastoral care for the Sudanese
- Providing Christian education to the Sudanese community and
- Doing outreach among the new Americans in our community from Africa

Some other things to keep in mind are:

- They will not take over any pastoral duties from Pastor Dave or Pastor Chris. They may help with the liturgy at our regular worship services, but they will not preach.
- If our congregation calls them and they successfully complete their studies, they will be ordained in September.
- Visiting with the Sudanese, it is beneficial to recognize that Daniel is seen now as the senior vicar, and that would continue to be the case. Daniel would have the senior pastor position in the Sudanese community and Samuel the associate pastor position.

Through the support of our congregation and its pastors, ministry to people of a different culture and language has been happening at Beautiful Savior. At the voters' meeting in March, we will be looking at taking another step in this mission work by calling pastors.

Show Me? God Did Just That in Christ Jesus

If you had to pick a U.S. vacation destination based on state mottos, it's safe to assume people would give my home state a wide berth. Why? The Missouri motto doesn't highlight any majestic state attraction. It doesn't beam with civic pride over any local product. It doesn't scream "come and visit; you'll be glad you did." Nope. The "Show Me State" warns that they're ready to disbelieve you.



When it comes to the truth of the Scriptures, however, Missourians are not the only skeptics. The world has increasingly abandoned the idea of God by adopting a "show me" attitude. Comedians like Woody Allen point to the fallen, sinful broken nature of the world as proof that God does not exist. Allen says if he has to accept the idea of God, he has to admit: "He's an underachiever."

"Scientific" minded individuals, meanwhile, like to remove God from the equation when finding answers to the origins of both the universe and species on this planet. They too say "show me" when it comes to God. Never mind that science cannot truly explain the idea of something coming from nothing, nor has science observed natural selection and adaptation producing new creatures. (Darwin's finches are still finches.)


For Christians, it's important to remember that when it comes to God, the "show me" crowd has forgotten or ignored history. It would take a very long time to chart all the ways God has acted within the confines of human history in the Scriptures, so I have chosen just a few.

In the Gospel of John alone, Jesus performs signs as an overwhelming demonstration of His divinity and as a proof of truth concerning His testimony as the one whom the true God has sent as savior.

Jesus miraculously feeds 5,000 with just two fish and five loaves of bread before making the claim "I am the bread of life," a bread that goes way beyond physical sustenance. When Jesus cures a man who had been blind from birth, it gives miraculous credence to Christ's claim that he is "the light of the world," a statement that has deeper ramifications than meets the eye. Jesus comes to restore the spiritually blind by showing people their sin and, more importantly, showing people their savior.


Most remarkably, the resurrected Jesus appears to doubting disciples, fearing family and weeping women, backing up his claim that he would suffer, die and rise again so that repentance and forgiveness of sins would be preached in His name.

Jesus is at his "show me" best after Thomas the disciple has been told Jesus is alive. Thomas responds with the ultimatum "unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails and place my hand into his side, I will never believe," (John 20:25b). Eight days later, Jesus appears to Thomas, who hears, sees and touches the risen Christ.



The point is that we do not have a blind faith. I like to tell the confirmation kids that not believing in Jesus is like not believing in George Washington. Our hope is built on apostolic witness and testimony that faithfully recorded the words and deeds of Jesus in history. And those things were recorded and written so that we might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing, you may have life in His name.

So the next time you might be tempted to ask God to "show you" that He loves you or that he even exists at all, remember the healing words of Luke, the good doctor and evangelist who records what happened before Jesus ascended into heaven: "(Jesus) presented himself alive to (the disciples) after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God," (Acts 1:3).


