## Encourage One Another Through a Much Different COVID-19

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you," (1 Thess. 5:16-18).

With every passing day, red dots creep across the world map, calling to mind the relentless advance of the coronavirus. Empty shelves at the store only feed our panic. Social distancing brings isolation close to home. Amid our current worldwide pandemic, you may lack the strength to rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances. You may face economic hardship, loneliness, health care concerns, additional responsibilities to care for and educate your children and a host of other difficulties and challenges.

When Paul wrote these words to the church in Thessalonica, he addressed new Christians who had experienced suffering, persecution and hardship. His exhortation came amid dire and dark times. But through any and every dark time, Paul proclaimed Christ as the source and center of our rejoicing, prayers and thanksgiving. He writes: "For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing," (1 Thess. 5:9-11).

### God is in Control

When Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said to his disciples, "You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of Man will be delivered up to be crucified." Then the chief priests and

the elders of the people gathered in the palace of the high priest, whose name was Caiaphas, and plotted together in order to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him. But they said, "Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar among the people," (Matthew 26:1-5).

Are you a controller? It seems that most people like to be in control of the situation around them or at least think they are in control.

On Tuesday of Holy Week, the chief priests and elders of the people thought they were in control. They schemed to arrest Jesus and kill him. They would wait until after the Passover festival. But, eventually, they were sure, they would get rid of him.

But who was really in control? It wasn't the chief priests and elders. It was Jesus! Even as the chief priests and elders made their plans to arrest and kill Jesus after the Passover, Jesus was telling his disciples that it would happen during the Passover. Who was in control? Jesus was!

And so, he remains in control today. True, we often question his control and even fight against his control. But, thankfully, God's control doesn't depend on how well we follow him. God remains in control whether we willingly bow to his control or fight tooth and nail against it.

Knowing that Jesus was in control of the Holy Week events makes them all the more beautiful. It reminds us that he willingly did this because he loves us! Thank God that Jesus was in control then and that he is still in control today.


