Amid Our Misplaced Objections, God Refuses to Remove Protection Detail

In the interest of keeping the eighth commandment, take to heart that the following column does not seek to make a political statement or commentary about President Joe Biden.

Business Insider recently reported that President Joe Biden has asked Secret Service agents to keep out of his bedroom during breakfast. The president prefers to start his days wearing his robe and eating his morning meal undisturbed by protection detail.

"I think all of the help that's there, providing meals, and all the rest, I think they love us," said Biden, who commended the Secret Service for their attentiveness to his well-being. However, the president explained he liked to break with certain protocols to live a more normal life.

"It is very hard to get comfortable (with them there) like I would ordinarily be," Biden said.

You have a similar, but far greater, protection detail. God's gracious presence attends to you wherever you go. But as you indulge the sinful nature or deal with the shame, regret and guilt of sin you might tell God to keep away. Such an unwise request from you stands as an impossible endeavor for your loving God. This assurance prompted David to write: "Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!" (Psalm 139:7-8).

David goes on to note for himself and his readers that even before you existed, God ordered all your days! In His book, your days were written before "there was none of them," (Psalm 139:16).

In your baptism, God clothed you with the robe of Christ's righteousness, which covers all your sin. In your baptismal waters, the Lord gave you the Helper, the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, who prepare

At the beginning of your days, God formed your inward parts and knitted you together in your mother's womb, (Psalm 139:13). How important is

your welfare? God's thoughts for you outnumber the grains of sand upon the earth (Psalm 139:18). And David ends Psalm 139 on a high note praising God, who graciously leads you in the way



of life everlasting (Psalm 139:24).

Amid all this glorious attention, your Old Adam cringes. He loves keeping away from God's love and protection. Maybe he even convinces you to remain in hiding because you're a mess. But don't dwell on your Old Adam's vain efforts. You're covered.

In your baptism, God clothed you with the robe of Christ's righteousness, which covers all your sin. In your baptismal waters, the Lord gave you the Helper, the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, who prepared and opened your heart and mind to receive God's goodness in Christ through faith. The Lord gives you both His Spirit and His Son in Word and Sacrament to keep you clinging to and living in His protection detail.

Amid misplaced objections, God refuses to take a break from breaking into the lives of those He has sworn to serve and protect. Even though God sees you at your weakest and darkest, He lovingly comes to your rescue. Your weakness and darkness are some of the reasons why He comes to your rescue! He shatters the schemes of sin, death and the power of the devil that seek to wipe out the new life and eternal life you have in Him.

How fitting, then, that David proclaims: "You hem me in, behind and before and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high. I cannot attain it," (Psalm 139:5-6).

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." John 6:51


"What's to eat?" That's the question heard daily, and the answer can be found in the refrigerator, the pantry, or the cupboard. Often one of those sources provides a solution and the hunger is satisfied.

"What's to eat?" This question can be understood in a completely different way. Instead of focusing on an empty stomach, it can also focus on the empty soul. What satisfies this hunger? Many people look for answers in all kinds of places. Most rely on what I must do myself to satisfy the hunger pangs of my guilty soul. Unfortunately, all these self-reliant solutions only leave me hungry. Worse yet, I soon come to the realization I am dying from spiritual starvation. Where do I turn to find life-giving bread that feeds my hungry soul?

The answer is found only in Jesus. His words are simple, yet profound: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven." There is no doubt about what Jesus offers. It is bread which gives life. Not only does it fill my starving soul, but it also nourishes me with eternal life.
