Welcome! The Baptism of our Lord is an “epiphany” of the one true God in the flesh. Jesus is the chosen servant of the Lord, anointed with the Spirit for the rescue of God’s people. He makes all things new, and is given “as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations,” (Isaiah 42:6). In the waters of the Jordan, He takes His place with sinners and takes all the sins of the world upon Himself. He undergoes a Baptism of repentance to “fulfill all righteousness” for us (Matthew. 3:15), submitting Himself to the curse of sin and death to redeem us. We are baptized with a Baptism like His, thereby dying and rising with Him, so that “we will also live with him,” (Romans 6:8). Baptized into Christ Jesus, God anoints us with His Spirit and names us as beloved and well-pleasing sons and daughters.

Old Testament Reading Isaiah 42:1-9

Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law.

Epistle Reading Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that

Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
