

What do I get for the one who has everything?

Sometimes, giving poses a challenge, especially for those who seem to possess everything.

As we approach the season of Christmas, remembering the gift of the Lord drawing near to us in the person of Christ, the Gospel compels us to give back. But how can we give to the one who already has everything? What can we bring to the creator of heaven and earth? How can we top the one who gives all good gifts? The Psalmist posed this question asking, "What shall I render to the LORD for all His benefits to me?" (Psalm 116:12)

The Psalmist did not propose to meet or grant something the Lord needed. Instead, the Psalmist vows to continue to receive God's gifts with a thankful, open heart: "I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord, I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all His people," (Psalm 116:13-14).

Notice, however, that Psalm 116 emphasizes that our praise, thanksgiving and faith can serve as a testament to others, so they too might receive God's gift of salvation.

As Paul goes to the Areopagus in Athens, he affirms that God does not need anything from anyone, yet the apostle has been called to proclaim the Gospel: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an altar with this inscription: 'To the unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, nor is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, because He himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything," (Acts 17:22-25).

Jesus, too affirms the Gospel transforms our lives into one of witness and proclamation: "And he said to them, 'Is a lamp brought in to be put under a basket, or under a bed, and not on a stand? For nothing is hidden except to be made manifest; nor is anything secret except to come to light," (Mark 4:20-22).

As we enter the Advent and Christmas season, warmed by the babe of Bethlehem as Immanuel, God with us, what do we give to the One who has everything and gives everything? We join the Psalmist, Paul and all in faith, giving our creator laud, honor and praise in worship. We receive His gifts with thanksgiving. We proclaim His salvation to those around us, not because of something born from God's needs but because the world really needs the Good News of Christ!

God bless your Advent preparation and Christmas celebration!

We are included in God's Family

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, ⁵ to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. Galatians 4:4-5

Christmas is a time for celebrating family. It is a time to gather together as parents and children, as siblings and cousins, as grandparents and grandkids—what a joy it is to be included in a family! Such joy would be rather void and empty if it weren't for another family relationship we celebrate at Christmas—a far more important family relationship—our relationship with God through faith in Christ. The apostle Paul speaks of that family relationship in Galatians chapter four. He speaks of us receiving from "God adoption as sons." It is amazing to be included in God's family as one of His dear children.

But it wasn't always that way. In fact, our relationship with God used to be completely broken. As human beings, we were born "under [God's] law." In other words, everything that God, the Giver of the law, demands of all people in his laws and commandments, God expects us to obey, and obey perfectly. However, as sinful human beings, we have lived under God's law imperfectly. We have broken God's law repeatedly, and we continue to do so every time we sin. Because of such disobedience, we deserve to be outside of God's family forever.

But it was never God's desire that we should live outside of His family. And so, God sent us His Son to be our Savior from sin. In pure grace, God molded and shaped the course of human history so that, at just the right time, "when the time had fully come," He could send His Son into the world. Though His Son was true God in every sense of the word, he became a human being, he was "born of a woman, born under law." The one true God and Giver of the law willingly became a man and placed himself under the law, all so that he could be just like us! But there was one difference. Unlike us, God's Son never sinned. He lived under His very own laws perfectly for his entire life. And then, when he gave up his life on the cross of Calvary, the one who lived perfectly washed all of our sins away in his blood and gave us his perfection in return. And now, when God looks at us, He no longer sees any sin. He sees only His own Son's perfection. We are part of His holy family. And we will be forever.

Yes, Christmas is a time for celebrating family. We celebrate because of the saving work of God's Son, we are included in God's family.
