Forget Black Friday Sales; Good Friday Paid Your Debts

As a general rule, the closer it gets to Christmas, the more it costs to buy gifts. But when the calendar hits Black Friday, retailers promise unbelievable bargains and top deals. This year, Black Friday extended beyond just a few days. Like your waistline during the holidays, it bloated into an indulgence that lasted several weeks. What a break for you! But Black Friday isn't about Christmas goodwill. It seeks to ensure that retailers end the year in the black rather than the red. It seeks to ensure revenues surpass expenses.

This reminds me of another noteworthy Friday.

This Friday does not involve any payments from you.

This Friday truly delivers something you sorely need.

This Friday guarantees that merit exceeds debts.

This Friday came when the holy, innocent, divine Son of God suffered and hanged on a cross to pay the price for all of humanity's sin, including yours. This Friday came, when out of love and compassion, Jesus made your iniquities and transgressions as His own. There, He faced the blackness of physical and spiritual death for you. Abut when our Lord rose from the dead, death is undone. It no longer has claim or power over you, for the wages death demands have been paid in full. It might seem a stretch to think about Good Friday during the seasons of Advent and Christmas, but the closer it gets to Christmas, remember the cost our Lord paid to buy your gifts of forgiveness life and salvation.

Martin Luther once wrote: "This Child, the Son of God, is your Savior; you are to be helped from sin and death. Now it is in itself a great and glorious thing that God has become man. But this is far more, that He is to be our spiritual and eternal Savior. Whoever would rightly believe this, could tell what true joy is. Yes, if his heart were full of this faith, he could, for great joy, not live long; for his heart could not bear the joy."

2023 Advent Series Explores Christ's Arrival to Battle the Forces of Darkness

During Advent and Christmas, we look forward to and celebrate Christ's arrival as a aby. Often viewed through the lens of sentimentality, this baby can represent God's love for everyone apart from any deep focus on fallen creation. For some, He represents a general "miracle of birth and new life." He is harmless and inoffensive. However, the people of Israel longed for a mighty ruler who would crush their enemies.



In the beginning of Mark's Gospel, Jesus appears suddenly as an adult to be baptized by John in the Jordan. Advent means arrival, and in Mark's Gospel, Jesus does arrive. At His baptism, Jesus is demonstrated to be Messiah and Lord. He is declared to be the Son of God and then is thrown out into battle against Israel's true enemies. In Mark's version of our Lord's advent, Jesus is a threat. He arrives to destroy the evil dominion of the devil, sin, and death. By His coming, God's people are freed, and Jesus alone has become Lord.

Our three-week midweek Advent series "Dominus: The Advent of the Son of God in the Gospel of Mark" will begin at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 6, and conclude Wednesday, Dec. 20.

The Growing Together in Grace project is officially open for bidding. We are thankful for all involved in this project and for their hard work.

As the architect and engineers completed their preparations for bidding, a building code requirement has necessitated a change to the scope of work to include the roof in Phase 1 instead of Phase 2. This means we will be returning to our churches in the near future to ask for permission to increase the budget to include the roof.

As of Nov. 20, \$852,843 is pledged to the GTIG campaign. We continue to push toward a fully-funded project.
