As confessional Lutherans, we have grown accustomed to giving God the glory. We recognize, on the basis of Scripture, that God does not grant salvation based on any merit or worthiness in us. Instead, He forgives our sins for Christ's sake, according to His abundant grace and mercy.

When it comes to faith, we again note God's essential activity, confessing the Biblical witness in Luther's explanation to the third article of the Apostles' Creed: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength, believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to him. But the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."

Informed by the Scriptures and again, Luther's helpful explanation to the Creed, we also give God thanks because He has given us everything that we need to support this body and life.

The question remains, however, does our giving reflect this fact?

As we explore Christ's passion in the Gospel of Mark, one thing becomes abundantly clear. As evil


then we will truly see.

Too often, we defend our own greed, hoarding the income God so graciously has bestowed. We justify this attitude, saying that we work long and hard for all that is ours.

But God calls us to repent. In Deuteronomy, God issues a stern warning to the people who hold a prideful view of their economical standing: "Beware, lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' You shall remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your fathers, as it is this day," (Deut. 8:17-18.)

So what do the Scriptures tell us about giving? They are for it! It should be done willingly; as firstfruits, not leftovers; regularly; it should be done not to support a budget but in proportion to how we have been blessed.



The Old Testament tithe landed at 10 percent, but the New Testament nowhere lists the precise regulations about giving this tithe and that tithe to the Levites and the Temple and so on. Those precise regulations were to point us to Christ.

Yet the New Testament does not make faithful financial stewardship obsolete. Rather, the New Testament encourages the practice as part of our renewal in Christ. Paul writes, "But just as you excel in everything-- in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us --see that you also excel in this grace of giving," (2 Cor. 8:7).

As we enter into a new year, I pray the Lord, by the power of the Gospel, would lead you in a disciplined life of responsible stewardship. After all, Biblical giving – which is done willingly; as firstfruits, not leftovers; regularly; and proportionally – simply responds in faith for all that God has given to us.

"The Psalms: God's Comforting Word in Christ"

9:40 a.m. Sunday mornings

From the worship of the ancient children of Israel to the house gatherings of the early church, from the writings of Martin Luther to the newly published hymns and praise songs of today, the psalms have played a central role in the worship of God's people.

Yet to some, the psalms seem inaccessible and foreign. The language is, at times, removed from our everyday speech; we might be left wondering exactly what the writer is trying to say. Many passages inspire comfort, but others seem so harsh one wonders why they are in the Bible at all.

This study will introduce you to the language, teachings and history of the psalms so that this treasure chest of God's riches will be opened to you and enrich your worship life and devotional reading of the psalms. Yet the psalms go beyond religious poetry and song. They express far more than personal or congregational prayers. The psalms proclaim Jesus Christ—His mission and passion, His resurrection and return and His establishment of the everlasting Kingdom of God.


