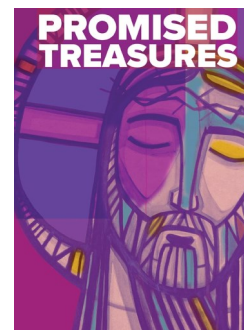
When you think about the end of the world, how you deal with it depends on the messenger. In many dystopian movies, a disheveled nut stands on a bustling corner, perched on top of a box, spouting fire and brimstone while holding a sign that proclaims: "the end is nigh." And we all know about religious people who claim to have cracked the code about the end of the world, maybe even received direct divine revelation about the Last Day -- only for the circled date on the calendar to pass while the world moves on.

Amid concerns about Russia's possible use of nuclear weapons in its war on Ukraine, climate change, biological threats, artificial intelligence and other factors, the Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists hit the alarm button on the

To a New Beginning

"Doomsday Clock" last month, moving the time to 90 seconds to midnight. (The closer to midnight the clock gets, the closer we are to supposed global annihilation.)

The Doomsday Clock stands the closest to midnight since its invention in 1947, when scientists working on the first nuclear weapons used the clock to warn just how close humanity was to destroying itself. An article from *National Geographic* that came out last January -- when the Doomsday Clock stood at 100 seconds to midnight -- warned that 100 was too close for comfort: "Not even at the height of the Cold War, when Americans were digging fallout shelters and kids were being told to 'duck and cover' under their school desks in case of atomic attack, were the clock's hands this far into the final countdown."

When you think about the end of the world, how you deal with it depends on the messenger. Before you begin to dismiss the end of the world as pure fear mongering, you should probably know that all the signs of the end of the age that Jesus mentions in Luke 21 have come to pass: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom." Check. "There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences." Check. Speaking to His disciples, Jesus said: "They will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name's sake." Check. "You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death." Check. (All the apostles except John were martyred.) "When you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near." Check. (Jerusalem was destroyed, along with the Temple, in 70 A.D.)

If you remain unconvinced that the end is imminent, hear what Jesus says in Luke 21:34: "Truly, I say to you, **this generation** (the one to whom Jesus spoke these words originally) will not pass away until all these things take place."

Christians should not dismiss the idea that Jesus can and will come soon. But Christians also should not worry. It might be 90 seconds to midnight, too close for your comfort, but that doesn't mean your annihilation is imminent. Even as the entire creation heads toward the appointed time of a new age, Jesus comforts us with the words: "Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

You don't have to worry about a great battle to seal the Lord's victory. That victory happened on Easter. That means you can wait with hope for the return of Jesus, who comes to make all things new, including you. That process doesn't begin at His return, it began at your baptism, continues in Christ's kingdom of Grace as You receive Word and Sacrament and is brought to completion in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ! On That Day, the end is not the end for those in faith -- it is the end of sin and death in us. It is the beginning of a renewed heavens and renewed earth!

While we carry around the sinful flesh, as God draws near to us, it might seem a little too close for comfort. For the Lord in His full glory is an intimidating thought! As a sinner, maybe we can picture ourselves singing stanza three of Abide with Me: "Come, not in terrors, as the King of Kings. But kind and good with healing in Thy wings." Yet because Christ has given you His righteousness, remain confident in Christ's Word and Promise, and in faith, sing even louder: "Tears for all woes. A heart for every plea. Come, Friend of sinners, thus abide with me!"

Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!

“For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty.” (2 Peter 1:16).

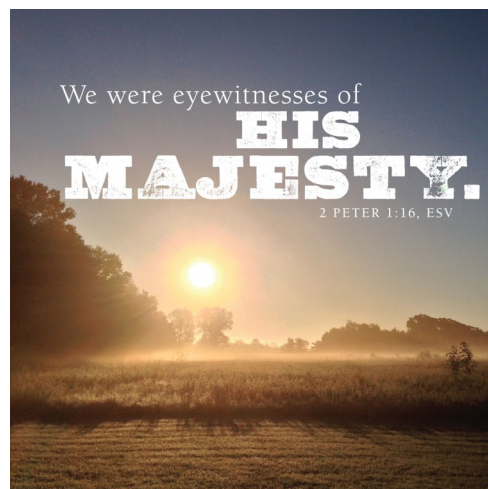
When a person is put on the witness stand in a courtroom, they are not allowed to speculate. They cannot guess what they think might have happened. Nor are they allowed to let their opinions color their answers. They can only tell what they have actually seen and heard.

There are many fantastic stories about Jesus Christ. We hear of him walking on water. There’s the report that he fed thousands of people with just a few fish and a couple of loaves of bread. He healed the sick. We even hear about Jesus raising people from the dead, including himself! How are we to take these things? Did they really happen?

The answer is “Yes.” We know that they happened because God moved the men, who were eyewitnesses to these things, to write them down for us. We find the eyewitness accounts of Jesus’ life in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

More importantly, there we find the reason that Jesus came to this earth. He came to be our Savior. We have the eyewitness accounts of how Jesus fulfilled his Father’s will in our place. We read the account of Jesus’ suffering and death, knowing that he did this to take the punishment that we deserved. And we read those eyewitness accounts of Jesus’ rising from the dead, showing us that victory has been won.

Thankfully, the men who wrote the accounts of what Jesus has done for us were not just giving their opinions. They gave us the facts about what they witnessed. And we can be certain that what they have written is reliable.

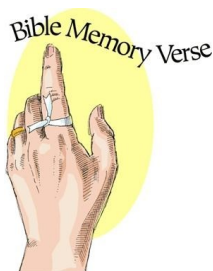

LCEF North Dakota District College Scholarship

The Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) North Dakota District College Scholarship was developed to encourage college students in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) North Dakota District to pursue their educational goals. A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to at least one applicant. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior with a minimum 3.0 GPA or current full-time post-secondary student at an accredited institution with at least one year of courses remaining and a minimum 2.5 GPA.
