Gospel Trumps Tradition

Sometimes, you have to kill your darlings.

One of my college professors broke this news to me in a creative writing class. I later heard the same thing from a colleague in the publications department at Saint Louis University.

In the context in which I heard it, killing your darlings involves removing something from an article or story that doesn't quite fit. It could mean removing a crafty phrase, a well-written paragraph or a favorite character.

Usually, someone from the outside has to suggest killing a darling because the writer tends to embrace and cling to a specific part of the story instead of the story as a whole. A well-meaning editor usually has to pull out the red pen and surgically strike at the material doing more harm than good.

Traditions can sometimes fall into the darling category. Don't get me wrong, traditions add luster and meaning to moments in our lives. But sometimes, they get in the way. Sometimes, we get so caught up in expectations, traditions and the shape of how we want things to be that we forget the way things are.

The expectations of some of the people of Israel led them to reject the Christ because they could not believe that God would or could come in the flesh. Others rejected Jesus because they expected him to fulfill more of a nationalist, militaristic Messianic role. These preconceived notions blocked the way for the Gospel. People missed out on a Savior because they could not get past their darlings.

I know a man who grew up going to 11 p.m. service on Christmas Eve. He moved to a different community, and no church held a similar service. Dejected, he decided he would not attend services on Christmas Eve because the services were not like the one he remembered and cherished. The man embraced and clung to a specific part of the story instead of the story as a whole. He cherished the service more than the Gospel itself.

In His first letter, the apostle St. John writes, "what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and, indeed, our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son, Jesus Christ." (1 John 1:3).

As we move from the season of Christmas into Epiphany, I hope you let go of some of those traditions, expectations and attitudes that take on more importance than the Gospel and Jesus. Remaining in God's Word and Sacrament is not just a tradition, it falls under the unchanging will of God for us. It's where God meets us and blesses us as His salvation story continues to break into the here and now. It's where he makes us His darlings in Christ Jesus, killing the Old Adam in us to that the New Adam might rise to life.

God killed His Darling: the holy, perfect, sinless son of God, so that we might have fellowship with Him. Through the means of grace, God's Spirit calls and keeps us living in the blood-bought suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. It's where God surgically removes sin and death and hell from your story and replaces it with Christ's holiness, innocence and blessedness for all eternity!

Dear Body of Christ,

It is customary for the District Convention to have a mission offering. Therefore, this letter is to invite all of our North Dakota District LCMS delegates, pastors, and congregations to participate in the 2018 Convention Mission Offering. This year's convention offering will be designated for Wittenberg Chapel on the UND Campus in Grand Forks, ND.

The purpose of Wittenberg Chapel is to serve our youth from our congregations attending college there with Word and Sacrament ministry and to reach out to the rest of UND students on the campus with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The reason for the mission offering needed for the Wittenberg Chapel and ministry is that early in 2017 the District Board of Directors considered to end the Wittenberg ministry by closing and selling the facility. This action was because of the chapel roof leaking and fear of what it would cost to fix it. Along with that, the district-called pastor there retired. It was also a consideration of what it might take to update the parsonage that you the district own also. It just didn't seem that we as a district had the funds to continue that ministry with good stewardship of the gifts that you give. Many of the district congregations, pastors, and people expressed great concern about this and desired that we keep the ministry going there.

Therefore, the District Board of Directors checked into the roof repair on the chapel and updating the parsonage and decided that the \$47,900 to repair the chapel roof and \$20,000 updating of the parsonage was good stewardship and also that we would call a full-time pastor for that position.

Due to the expense the district has invested and the desire of many of the district congregations, pastors and people to continue this ministry, I am confident in asking you and your congregations to participate in the District Convention Offering.

Between now and the January 21-24, 2018 District Convention in Dickinson, I would ask you and your congregation to consider a generous offering towards Wittenberg Chapel and Ministry. Your entire congregation may want to get involved in this effort including your Sunday School, youth, LWML, and all the members of your congregation. Your delegates are asked to bring your congregation's mission offering to the convention, which will be received during Tuesday evening's banquet. Please make checks out to "ND District LCMS" and write "Wittenberg Convention Offering" in the memo.
