Jesus then suffered and died for us, taking the full punishment and wrath for sin, being forsaken by the Father. This is a suffering we will never have to know or experience because of what Jesus endured on our behalf and in our place.

Through hearing God's Word, He even gives us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. We look at Jesus with the eyes

of God-given faith and see promises and more promises. And we know those promises are sure. That is why it is through Him that we utter our Amen (yes, yes, let it be so) to God for His glory.

Voters' Meeting Update: Grace Lutheran School Capital Campaign

The June Voter's Meeting was held on June 11. During this meeting, the Growing Together in Grace (GTG) project was presented regarding fundraising for Phase I of the plan. In March 2023, we voted to approve Grace Lutheran School to move forward with the GTG project. However, it was not until the June 11 meeting where our members voted on the Beautiful Savior congregation dollar commitment.

Beautiful Savior was fortunately blessed with an anonymous matching gift of up to \$50,000. Therefore, the recommendation and vote approved was to create our own campaign within BSLC to gather commitments and contributions from the congregation members to meet and exceed the \$50,000 matching gift. We are confident we will surpass the matching gift and be able to provide Grace Lutheran School with a commitment of a minimum of \$100,000. To support the GTG construction timeline, we desire to receive a majority of those commitments by Aug. 15. The commitment is what we pledge to provide in funds over the next



three years to the GTG project. It does not mean all funds need to be received by this August, rather what our members have pledged to contribute to Grace Lutheran School regarding the GTG project. Pledge cards will be mailed to our members by the end of July.

What is the purpose of the building improvement campaign, GTG? A recent building assessment determined that the physical building is in great condition, making a building renovation the most logical option for growth and improvement. Phase 1 of GTG takes care of many pressing needs, including improved building security, an up-to-date fire safety system, air conditioning, energy efficient heating, ventilation, replacement windows and high quality classroom improvements.



LWML 40th Biennial Convention

Five women from Beautiful Savior, Marlys Gregory, Maxine Rust, Shirley Elsner, Deb Schimek and Emma Parkman (Young Woman Representative for North Dakota), traveled to the LWML convention in Milwaukee, WI, on June 22-25. The theme for the convention was "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations," based on Psalm 33:12-13, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people He chose for his inheritance. From heaven the LORD looks down and sees all mankind." As His children, they celebrated the Lord of the nations.

Convention attendees celebrated our Lord through Word and Sacrament, honored God by serving our neighbors and proclaimed His message to the nations.

They took part in servant events making Gifts from the Heart: Orphan Grain Train, A Place of Refuge, recycled "new and like-new" eyeglasses, and put together items for Phil's Friends. They attended special interest luncheons and also did the Mission Pledge walk.

The convention started on Thursday evening with a communion service. The convention ended with a service of sending worship with the theme of "Jesus Christ, Hope for the Nations."

There were more than 3,500 in attendance with a mission goal set for \$2,350,000 for the 2023-2025 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 31 mission grants. The next convention will be in Omaha, NE.

The LWML would like to thank the congregation for giving to the loose change Sunday event in April. That amount was matched by the LWML, for a total of \$700, which was given to mites for the Mission Mite Pledge walk.

The North Dakota banner taken to convention, displayed a background that was half light blue with a sun and half black with a moon and stars, which represents the day and night of God's creation. The depiction of the globe with

Ambassadors are Meant to Represent

"This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful," (1 Corinthians 4:1-2).

"I'm only the messenger." Have you ever said that to someone when forced to break bad news? "Don't be upset with me; I'm only the messenger."

No one likes being the bearer of bad news, delivering a message that an audience won't like. But sometimes, that's what ambassadors get paid to do. They're not asked to sugarcoat the king's message in order to make it more bearable for the hearers. They have one job; repeat the words of the one who sent them. Ambassadors don't have permission to go off-script; they are meant to represent. Above all else, they must prove faithful.

But that's not only true when you've been asked to announce bad news. That's also the case when ambassadors are sent to proclaim good news. They aren't allowed to hold back or to make it sound less exciting than it is. The king sends his ambassadors to shout out good news from the rooftops so that everyone can hear!

What a joy and privilege it has been to be an ambassador of the good news of Jesus among you! It has been an honor to share with you, the best news ever. That through Jesus, God has reconciled the world to Himself, not counting our sins against us (2 Corinthians 5:19). Death has been conquered forever. Eternal life is yours, no strings attached, through faith in Jesus. That's good news.



Even though my call as pastor at Beautiful Savior will end in July, I am reminded that we are still partners in the Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus. Wherever we are, we have the privilege and honor of serving the same God and Lord. Wherever we are, God comes to us in Word and Sacrament with His mercy and forgiveness that we need but don't deserve. And wherever we are, we have been charged to live out our Christian faith as a grateful response to all that God has done and continues to do for us.

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ," (Philippians 1:3-6).
