Problems? Talk It Out Using God's Word

Please don't follow the model of current public discourse. The realm of debate has descended into ad hominem, which attacks people's character rather than discuss viewpoints or red herrings, which seeks to distract or lead people away from the real issues. Instead of engaging one another in meaningful dialogue, public discourse has become another arena of entertainment in which people lift themselves up at the expense of taking others down.

Need evidence? Look online. Social media allows us to connect like never before, yet it also allows a degree of detachment that encourages deliberate, terse and abusive attacks. Some Twitter users, especially, have a propensity to unleash sordid and savage discourse at someone else's expense. You most likely have heard of the term "Twitter War," a most appropriate moniker that glorifies inappropriate behavior disguised as debate.

Communication, at its core, is about sharing ideas while also connecting to others. Communication always has been hampered by sinful behavior. But today's society has sharpened communication to seek and destroy with impunity.

It's easy for those of us in the church to fall prey to these cultural shifts. As we communicate with one another, there are two approaches I hope we will avoid:

Problems? Talk It Out...

The first is talking over someone. This approach turns up the volume and the shock. It seeks to drown out all other voices so they will not be heard. Yet the Scriptures encourage us, especially in our public witnessing, to engage others "with gentleness and respect."

The second approach is talking about someone. This goes the way of complaining about someone but never trying to actually solve the problem. Instead of confronting someone about a disagreement, this approach attempts to rally others to your cause but does not really care about repairing the relationship that has been affected by the disagreement.

The Scriptures, however, **encourage us to talk to someone**, most notably, the one with whom there has been a disagreement. You do this face to face in hopes that you might come to an agreement or at least an understanding. This move may be difficult, awkward and even painful, but it seeks to keep the relationship intact. This is the spirit behind Matthew 18, which sets parameters concerning problems between individuals in the church. Yet this approach of talking to someone instead of over or about someone – should be applied in many different situations.

We all must admit we can be a bit too carefree with our words. James reminds us that this is a problem in the third chapter of his letter: "But no human being can tame the tongue," he writes. "It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so."

In a world bent on cracking down on inappropriate behavior, we advocate a culture of respect and personhood, but in our dialogue with one another, we demonstrate a lack of respect for others because we are too focused on our own militant viewpoint winning the day. If we are to care about others, our words matter, too.

Thankfully, we have the Word of God. We can speak Law, when appropriate, to one another. We speak Gospel, when appropriate to one another. And when we can't decide and things become muddled, we are encouraged to err on the side of the Gospel.

Of course, this approach does not carry over very well into many of the arenas of public discourse and in a society ever further from the one true God. But Paul had some great advice for the way we talk to one another in our life together as the church. We stay on track when we do what the church does: receiving God's Word and repeating God's Words right back to God and others.

Paul urges: "Be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ, $D \rightarrow Christ$
