Martin Luther said "Job is magnificent and sublime as no book of Scripture." Others have called Job "the Shakespeare of the Bible." During our midweek Lenten and Holy Week services, we will explore this magnificent

composition that is numbered among the greatest literature of all time We invite you to attend the 7 p.m. midweek worship services and our soup and sandwich suppers from 6-6:45 p.m. before services.

Our Lenten emphasis, "The Book of Job: Blessed be the name of the Lord," seeks to apply Job to our lives so that we may draw upon God's promises and endure in faith through life's dark valleys. In conjunction with our services, we also will be exploring the book of Job during our 7 p.m. Tuesday Bible studies beginning March 12.

Job's most famous statement appears in 19:25, as he proclaims, "I know that my Redeemer lives." Christ is alive. He has conquered death and the grave. His word is sufficient. His grace is enough. His love brings comfort and healing. And this Lent these gifts come to us through the book of Job.


