
Need someone to listen, help and give comfort? Christ invites us to pray

Facebook. Instagram. Snapchat. Skype. Zoom. E-mail. Even the phone! With so many avenues for connection, communication should be a breeze. But immediate help often evades us. When will you get a response to that important text or email? Why hasn't your urgent call been returned?

Beyond our personal relationships, the art of customer service needs a major upgrade. Website chats created for immediate assistance often cannot solve the problem. Automated help lines do not understand what you are saying, transfer you from department to department or put you on hold for what seems like an eternity.

Even face-to-face communication can falter. Apathy abounds. Misunderstandings occur. Discouraged by today's cold, distant communication, we might ask if anyone can or will take time out of their busy day to listen? To help? To comfort?



God never grows tired, weary or overwhelmed. He remains watchful and vigilant. He does not take his loving eye off you for even a second. "He will not let your foot be moved," the Psalmist declares. "He who keeps you will not slumber. Behold, he who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep," (Psalm 121:3-4).

We might be tempted to think that when we offer our requests and petitions to God that He does not respond. Maybe we indict God on His "customer service" policies. But God does speak to us. He speaks to us directly through the power and promise of His Word found in the Bible.

We especially have assurance that He hears us on account of Christ, who invites us (and even commands us) to go to our loving, heavenly Father, asking Him to grant us faith and His Holy Spirit. "What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion?" Jesus asks. "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Luke 11:11-13).

As you open God's Word, you will discover The One who listens, helps and comforts. Take some time out of your busy day to see what God has to say about calling on Him. Find more of God's promises in the Scriptures. You will hear about The One who perfectly and intentionally keeps you as His own through our Lord Jesus.

"But I will sing of your strength; I will sing aloud of your steadfast love in the morning. For you have been to me a fortress and a refuge in the day of my distress." (Psalm 59:16).

The man who wrote these words had some enemies in high places. David, the composer, wrote the words of this song when the king at the time, Saul, had sent men to watch David's house in order to kill him. I can hardly imagine the danger I would be in if the ruler of my country were trying to kill me. I'm not sure I would be singing. I think I would be trying to keep as quiet as possible, especially if people were watching my house with a view toward ending my residency there.

David was a brave man. In the face of danger, he sang. But he did not sing about his own strength or his own ability to defeat the king. David sang about the strength of the Lord his God, and not just about His strength, but also about His love. David knew that God was stronger than any king, and David knew that God loved him. David had a friend in an even higher place than the top of the government David had a friend in heaven.

I will sing aloud of your steadfast love in the morning.
(Psalm 59:16)

No matter your enemy, God is stronger. He is able to control the events of the world, large and small. There is nothing

happening in your life that is too big for God to handle. Even better, God loves you. He proved His love by sending His Son into the world to save you. He proves his love today by providing you refuge from your enemies, refuge in times of trouble. He forgives your sins and silences the mouth of your accusers, even of a guilty conscience. His promises are meant to give you security and comfort. He is your fortress, your trusty shield and weapon.

It's great to have friends in high places. Garth Brooks has friends in low places. But it's even greater to have a Savior and friend in heaven.

Congregational Memory Verse Challenge

Psalm 1 teaches us to meditate on God's Word day and night. It is our great opportunity and joy to read and study God's Word. One beneficial practice is to memorize the Scriptures and, in so doing, to meditate on it. The LCMS invites everyone to join together memorizing a verse each week.

<u>March 14</u>: 1 Peter 3:18 - For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit.

<u>March 21</u>: 2 Corinthians 5:21 - For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
