# Lenten Series: Christ Leads Us Out of Exile

With all the problems facing us today, we might feel like exiles: exiles from work, exiles from family, exiles from church and exiles from connections in general. This year's Lenten series, "Return from Exile: A Lenten Journey," gives the hearers opportunity to contemplate the reality of their earthly journey in exile, but with eyes always fixed on its ultimate destination—the empty tomb and the open gates of everlasting life—all with an underlying reality of joy as we hear that we do not walk this way alone. During the season of Lent, we travel with Christ from the Mount of Transfiguration to Jerusalem, where our Lord will face the cross and the grave for our sake.

Since the first sin in Eden, humanity has been exiled into the wilderness, wandering without any ability to find a way back to God. Each leg of our Lenten journey begins in the Old Testament and continues into the New Testament, pointing us to the joy that is ours on account of Christ Jesus, who brings us from exile into the promised land, the perfect place, the new garden, the courts of God's presence - the ultimate destination made ready for us by Jesus' death and resurrection.

Join us at 7 p.m. every Wednesday evening beginning with services on March 2. We also invite you to join us for soup and sandwich suppers at 6 p.m. before each service. Please bring a dish to share as we prepare to return from exile, led by the Lord Himself.



# Beautiful Savior Celebrates 40 Years The third in a series on the history of BSLC

The congregation officially became Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church on Aug. 23, 1982, when it was incorporated by the state of North Dakota.

On Nov. 7, 1982, Beautiful Savior received charter members through a special service and potluck dinner. Of the original 113 charter members, eight are still members of our congregation today. They are: Donna Larson, Charolette Simonson, Joan Fiechtner, Teresa Driscoll, Mike Herrmann, Ed and Carol Herrmann and Maxine (Yagow) Rust.

The constitution and bylaws were formally adopted on Dec. 5, 1982. On Dec. 12, 1982, the first voters meeting was held to elect officers, adopt a budget and call Pastor Bauer from missionary-at-large to pastor of Beautiful Savior.

Pastor Bauer continued to lead the ministry until he accepted a call to another congregation in April of 1990.

Beautiful Savior was led to call David Wagner as pastor, who was installed on July 29, 1990.

THE SUFFERING SERV

When he had entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, appealing to him, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, suffering terribly." And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion replied, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof, but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I too am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard this, he

marveled and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I tell you, with no one in Israel have I found such faith. I tell you, many will come from east and west and recline at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." And to the centurion Jesus said, "Go; let it be done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed at that very moment. (Matthew 8:5-13).

Everyone likes to be considered great for something. It feels good to hear someone say, "You have a great voice" or "You are a great cook" or "You are a great parent." At what would you most like to be great? How about being known for having a great faith? Imagine having Jesus himself say that you have a great faith. Wouldn't that be

wonderful? That is precisely what Jesus said about a Roman soldier whose servant was sick.

What made the soldier's faith so great? First, he was humble. He recognized that he did not deserve Jesus' help. He did not even consider himself worthy of having Jesus enter his house. He knew he was entirely dependent upon Jesus. So are you!

Everything you have and everything you are, is a gift from God. The only proper way to approach Him is with humility. It is the first ingredient of a great faith. The second ingredient is trust—trust that Jesus can do whatever you ask Him. The centurion trusted that Jesus could command the sickness to leave his servant just as easily as he, himself, could command soldiers to do his bidding. What a great faith!

Jesus did heal the centurion's servant. But...what if he hadn't? What do we do when Jesus decides not to do what we ask? Once again, we trust Him. We humbly trust that He knows what is best for us. We trust his promises to always and only do what is best for us. May God give you the faith of that centurion—a GREAT faith.
