A Texas judge who didn't know the particulars of his own state constitution accidentally triggered his own resignation on April Fool's Day.

No, this is not a joke.

When Texas civil court judge Bill McLeod announced his intention to run for the State Supreme Court, his declaration fell under Article 16, Section 65, of the Texas constitution, which states a judge's announcement of candidacy for another office "shall constitute an automatic resignation of the office then held." Oops.

His blunder sent officials and supporters scrambling. The county attorney's office brought the matter before county commissioners, who appoint replacements and could have decided to keep McLeod in office until a special election. But members of his own party decided it would be better for him to move on. Two Republicans on the Commissioners' Court voted to allow the judge to continue his work. 

was in the best interest of the citizens and voters in Harris County that the judge be replaced. McLeod, a Democrat, took office in November after winning the County's Civil Court No. 4 race with 55 percent of the vote.

Before you laugh too hard or develop a sense of superiority, remember that you have made drastic mistakes, forgetting your elected status as a saved child of God. This election did not come to fruition based on popular vote, your credentials or human will, but on the gracious and glorious mercy of God. Prompted by His grace in Christ and operating through the Holy Spirit and the means of Grace, God calls you, converts you, declares you blameless for Christ's sake, gives you holy impulses and keeps you in faith.



Yes, our ignorance, failures, weakness and outright rebellion disqualify us from God's Kingdom. God's law is quite clear. But the disciple John writes, "My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world," (1 John 2:1-2).

Jesus has turned away the Father's wrath by taking the guilt and punishment for all our sins. In addition, Jesus serves as an advocate, an arbiter, an intercessor to plead our case in the heavenly court, paying living testimony that he has served the sentences, paid the fines and made restitutions necessary for both justice and mercy to prevail.

Thanks be to God! By grace through faith, our mistakes don't cost our eternal election.

In his civil war book, "Glory Road," Bruce Catton shows us how dirty a human being can get. He recounts an episode in which a soldier leaves a prisoner-of-war camp to rejoin his old unit. His time as a POW had left him filthy beyond description. He asks his comrades to help him get clean. They take him into a river, strip off his clothes and begin to wash and scrub him. Only after this continues for a time do the man and his friends realize that he is still wearing an undershirt. The man's body had become so encrusted that it has been impossible at first to tell the difference between a soiled piece of clothing and his own skin.

The soiling nature of sin does the same thing. From the dark thoughts we allow to fester in our minds to all the deeds of love conveniently left undone, sin does more than leave a dirty streak here and there on our souls. It makes us spiritually filthy beyond description. Left to ourselves, our hearts are so encrusted by sin that it's impossible for us to see how lost we really are, how deep the pit really is.

That's where Jesus comes in. We didn't see how lost we were. But He did. We didn't see how far we had fallen. But He did. He took us to the river of his grace. He washed us in the waters of baptism. He cleansed us in the blood He shed on Calvary's cross. Now we stand before Him in robes of white. Now, through faith in Him, His forgiveness is our personal possession.

There are moments when the same old stench from the same old sinful habits can fill our nostrils with despair. When such a moment comes for you, remember who you are. Remember what Jesus has done. He has gone to the cross to wash you clean. He has risen from death to assure you that not one of your sins remains. Through his eyes your life is fresh and clean and new. Your days as a filthy prisoner are long gone.
