Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Gift Collection

Donations for both boys and girls between the ages of two and fourteen are being accepted for Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Gifts. There will be a gift-wrapped collection box in the narthex for you to drop off your items. We can also use empty shoeboxes and donations of \$9 per box for shipping. Drop items off by Nov. 19. Boxes will be filled that day and brought to the local collection center. In December, a group from our church will be volunteering at the OCC Processing Center in Minneapolis to get shoeboxes ready to ship to children all over the world who will receive the shoebox gift and hear about Jesus!

What goes into each box?

- “Wow” item: an outfit, stuffed toy, doll, soccer ball with pump or other small, fun item.
- Toys: cars, jump ropes, yo-yo’s, crafts.
- Accessories and hygiene: hat, socks, hair clips, toothbrush, comb, brush, washcloth, flashlight (include extra batteries).
- School supplies: notebooks, crayons, paper, pencils, sharpener, markers, solar calculator.

Growing in Faith Together celebrates all of God's gifts to us

God's Word points to a central truth: All we are and all we have come from God. Everything is a gift from him. Consider the Psalmist who declares, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world and all who live in it," (Psalm 24:1). Take to heart that "every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows," (James 1:17). Our salvation in Christ Jesus is a gift (Ephesians 2:8) and so is our God-given faith (1 Corinthians 12:3).



As you grow in knowledge of God's Word, the Holy Spirit reveals that God's generosity and goodness call you to be generous and good with what God has entrusted to you. This year's stewardship drive invites us to Grow In Faith Together (GIFT) as we discover that stewardship

includes the whole Christian life. Indeed, the Scriptures entreat you as a child of God to share ALL the gifts God has given you for the glory of God and benefit of neighbor.

Why is stewardship important? In his book, *Stewardship: A Theological Perspective*, Dr. Joel Biermann, professor at Concordia Seminary St. Louis, writes: "One cannot claim fidelity to Christian truth in other respects while ignoring the practice and inculcation of faithful stewardship. Proclamation of the Gospel, a focus on forgiveness, or a rigorous commitment to orthodox doctrine, are all worthy practices and defensible paradigms for the Christian life and ministry; but none of them obviate the practice of good stewardship. The doctrine of justification cannot be the camouflage beneath which one hopes to hide from the expectations of a call to serious stewardship. The Gospel does not negate or displace stewardship; it restores the creature to a life of responsible stewardship. Good theology yields good stewardship; more than that, good theology demands good stewardship."

In addition to educating and encouraging our members to follow God's will of faithful stewardship, our stewardship drive also helps Beautiful Savior plan for the upcoming year. A responsible budget must fall in line with what people are willing to give. Our ministry programs depend upon volunteers using their time and talent to help make these programs viable and successful.

To this end, we ask that you would fill out both a financial pledge card and a time and talent survey. The pledge card will be mailed to all BSLC members at the beginning of November, while the survey can be found on our website at www.beautifulsaviorfargo.com then go to the "Resources/Links" tab.
