God's Promise Remains: "**Everything That is Mine is Yours**" Mission and Stewardship Emphasis Puts 2020 Fatigue in Perspective

Although November just arrived, many people want to kick 2020 out the door and move on from a year that brought persistent civil unrest, a relentless pandemic and countless other unpleasant developments.

Yet amid all this uncertainty and difficulty, God has not removed His presence or promise from His people. He still comes to us in Word and Sacrament, offering us forgiveness of sins, life and salvation in Christ. He is still with us. We are still with Him.

In the 15th chapter of Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about two sons. In a scandalous development, one son asks his father for his inheritance. He leaves home and squanders his property in reckless living. Empty-handed and desperate, the son hopes to come back home as a mere hired hand. But upon the son's return, the Father completely restores his wayward child and hosts an extravagant feast celebrating the son's return.

But other problems develop in the family. The other son, who has remained home with his father, feels slighted. "Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command," the supposed loyal son says. "Yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!" (Luke 15:29-30).

He Will Prepare a Feast

"On this mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine the best of meats and the finest of wines," (Isaiah 25:6).

When was the last time you went to a banquet? You know, a fancy meal, probably in a fancy place, attended by people dressed up in their fanciest clothes. Perhaps it was a wedding banquet, or a banquet celebrating someone's retirement, or a couple's golden anniversary. We don't go to banquets every day. They're reserved for special occasions. Maybe even later this month, someone will be preparing a fancy feast to be eaten with friends and perhaps family.

In chapter 25 of his book, the prophet Isaiah wrote about an extraordinary banquet. It's extraordinary because of the host. Isaiah wrote that "the Lord Almighty" would prepare this banquet. We might glance over the words "Lord Almighty" without too much thought because they appear often in the Bible. But the name "Lord Almighty" is intended to express power. This is the God who summons and commands the angel armies! He sets the stars in their places and draws up the boundaries for the oceans. And yet, Isaiah insists that he is the one preparing a banquet.

And yet, Isaiah insists that he is the one preparing a banquet. Isn't that remarkable? The God we serve is also willing to serve us, to make sure that we have all we need—especially everything we need to feed our souls. This world is barren and devoid of rich spiritual food. Material possessions, humanistic philosophies, knowledge, relationships, adventure all claim that they can fill us up and make us satisfied. And they might for a while, but when all is said and done, we find ourselves still spiritually hungry.

What we really need is the food God prepares. And unlike most banquets, this feast is one that is before us every day—as we are filled up by God's Word revealed in the Bible. There we see Jesus, the bread from heaven, who feeds us with the forgiveness he won for us and soothes our thirst for joy and peace. Remember the psalmist, "Oh, taste and see that the Lord is good! Blessed is the one who takes refuge in him!" (Psalm 34:8). In Jesus, we have the most abundant spiritual feast imaginable.




Congratulations to Leah Tykwinski

Congregational Memory Verse Challenge

The church confesses to Christ, "You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). The church is encouraged to "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly ..." (Col. 3:16). Psalm 1 teaches us to meditate on God's Word day and night. It is our great opportunity and joy to read and study God's Word. One beneficial practice is to memorize the Scriptures and, in so doing, to meditate on it. The LCMS invites everyone to join together memorizing a verse each week.

<u>Nov. 1</u>: Hebrews 12:1 -- Therefore, because we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us.

Nov. 8: John 6:40 -- For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day.

<u>Nov. 15</u>: 1 Thessalonians 4:13–14 -- But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For because we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

Nov. 22: **Revelation 22:20 --** He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!

Nov. 29: **Jeremiah 23:5–6** -- "Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch. ... In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell securely. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.' "
