

Reformation Anniversary is Something to Celebrate By Pastor Chris

Is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation a celebration or a commemoration?

Some have argued it can't be the former. When the church split and fractured, it disrupted Christian unity. The church no longer stood as one. Although we might say this schism and the ones that followed are nothing to celebrate in and of themselves, we also must remember the bigger picture.

In Luther's day, the church had fallen prey to doctrines that betrayed the apostolic witness and the authority of Scripture. The assurance and truth of forgiveness of sins in Christ alone had been buried and obscured by a different Gospel that had become

no Gospel at all. People resigned themselves to a false belief that they could never be right with a Holy God and could only work or buy their way to God's favor or face several thousand years in purgatory's purifying fire before God would accept them.

Once, even Luther falsely understood the Gospel as a new expectation over and above the Law of the Old Testament as he read Romans 3:21 "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it."

"I was angry with God," Luther wrote, "and said, 'As if, indeed, it is not enough, that miserable sinners, eternally lost through original sin, are crushed by every kind of calamity by the law of the Decalogue, without having God add pain to pain by the gospel and also by the gospel threatening us with His righteousness and wrath!' "

Yet, through careful reading of the scriptures, Luther discovered that the righteousness of God did not refer to how God punishes undeserving sinners by the Gospel but instead how God declares sinners righteous for the sake of Jesus by the power of the Gospel! In order to fully understand Romans 3:21, Luther needed Romans 3:22, "the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe."

"There I began to understand that the righteousness of God is that by which the righteous lives by the gift of God, namely by faith," Luther wrote. "And this is the meaning: the righteousness of God is revealed by the gospel, namely, the passive righteousness of God with which merciful God justifies us by faith, as it is written, 'He who through faith is righteous shall live.' Here I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates.

There a totally other face of the entire Scripture once again showed itself to me."

What a relief when the true Gospel once again came! Dejected sinners with no hope now had assurance in the Gospel of Christ. Instead of looking down a long,

bleak road up through the pit and suffering of purgatory, those in the church heard that Christ endured suffering, pain and death for them so that they might be



spared the agony of being separated from God. That is something to celebrate!

Although we lament the split of the church, we remember that the Gospel could have been lost forever. So with joy and thankfulness, we can celebrate the Reformation and its continuing mission to proclaim the good news of the full forgiveness of sins in Jesus Christ for sinners like you and me.
