BSLC seeking hurting people -- and those who want to help them

Not too long ago, one of our members approached me and told me that she had struggled with extreme loneliness after her husband died. In the aftermath of that life-changing event (which had happened years before) our pastors visited her regularly, but she really needed more ongoing emotional support from others, especially after all the initial cards, calls and care dwindled.

Pastors always will be on the front lines of care, especially during times of crisis. But there will always be more need for ongoing care above and beyond what pastors can effectively provide by themselves. With this in mind, Beautiful Savior has joined the Stephen Ministry program to help minister to hurting people.

Many among us struggle with issues but try to handle them on their own; this is not God's design. God created us for community and relationship, and that becomes essential in a fallen, sinful broken world. Our Lord encourages us to love others as He loves us. Paul exhorts us to rejoice with those who rejoice and mourn with those who mourn.

What is Stephen Ministry?

Our congregation's Stephen Ministry equips lay people to provide one-to-one Christian care to those experiencing difficulties in their lives.

What is a Stephen Minister?

A Stephen Minister is a lay member of the congregation carefully selected to serve in a caregiving role commensurate with their spiritual gifts. Stephen Ministers receive 50 hours of training, along with ongoing supervision and education, to provide high-quality and distinctively Christian care.

What does a Stephen Minister do?

Stephen Ministers meet faithfully each week with their care receivers -- ready to listen, care, pray, support and encourage.

How do Stephen Minister help others?

Stephen Ministers can provide the emotional and spiritual care needed in a crisis or difficulty such as loss of a loved one; health concerns; job concerns; divorce; recovery from accident or disaster; loneliness; and much more.

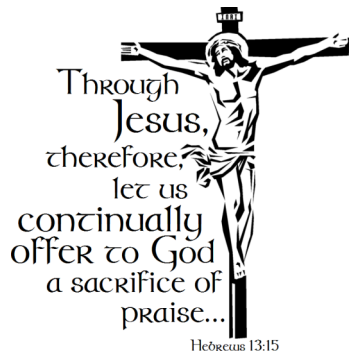

The Harvest is Plentiful

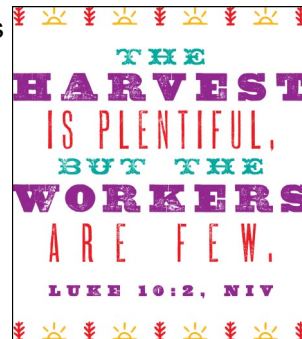

You plant your garden and spend all summer tending it. You eagerly watch the beans grow and the tomatoes ripen. But when the time comes, you're too busy to pick them. It's a shame when vegetables rot because they are not harvested.

It's an even greater shame when souls are not harvested. Jesus says that the world is ripe for harvest. There are countless people who do not know that he is their Savior and they are waiting to be harvested with that good news.

Don't miss the promise in Jesus' words: "many will believe and go to heaven." The harvest is plentiful. There's only one problem: the workers are few. Today, there are more than seven billion people in the world and only two billion Christians. Taking the gospel to more than five billion people is a daunting task.

So notice what Jesus does: he prepares harvest workers and sends seventy-two disciples into the field. But before they go, he tells them to pray for more help. This is a reminder that we are completely dependent on God's power to carry out his work.



A successful harvest does not depend on our skills or resourcefulness; it depends on Jesus. He has already done all the hard work. He lived a perfect life for the harvest, he died and rose for the harvest. He has given us the tools to bring it in; His Word, His baptism, and His true body and blood in the Lord's Supper.

The harvest is plentiful. So he calls us to pray for his help and work with the confidence that he will meet all our needs and bless our efforts.

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go.

² And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest," (Luke 10:1-2).
