No Life Without the Vine

Have you noticed nature's fireworks on display? Enjoy it while you can. Brilliant patches of orange, red and yellow light up the tree lines only to eventually fall away like so many dying embers.

Why does this happen? Cooler temperatures and dwindling daylight trigger a hormone that releases a chemical message to prepare for winter. In a stunning act of self-preservation for the tree, abscission cells form a bumpy line where the leaf stem meets the branch. Slowly, but surely, the leaf is "pushed" from the tree branch. Relegated to a husk of their former glory, the leaves dry up and turn brittle. Many will be trampled underfoot, ground into mulch, gathered into bags to be thrown away, or burned.

In John Chapter 15, Jesus shares these words: "As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in Me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned," (John 15:4b-7).

Relegated to a husk of their former glory, any branch without the true vine dries up and turns brittle. These branches have no life in them. They will be trampled underfoot, gathered in bags to be thrown away and burned in the eternal judgment. Don't think yourself above the problem.

In a stunning act of self-preservation, our sinful human nature does not sit around passively for us to fall away from God, it actively seeks to push us away from Him. Our Old Adam wants to hang around, driving us from God's salvation given fully and freely in Jesus Christ.

Many leaves have orange and yellow pigments, but with warmer temperatures and more sunlight, all the chlorophyll active inside the leaves mask these colors. Jesus has covered us in His holy precious blood, which doesn't just mask our sins, it covers them completely. And although we often push away from God, He has promised to draw near to us.

In the gift of our Baptism, our Lord Jesus unites us to Himself. He unites us to His own suffering, death and resurrection. He gives us His name, His righteousness and His Kingdom. Through these life-giving waters, He gives us the Holy Spirit, so that by daily



contrition and repentance, our Old Adam should be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to life.

Our Vine, the Lord Jesus, also has promised to come to us with His very body and blood in the Lord's Supper, given for us Christians to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins. Our Lord, the Vine, has also promised to abide with us by His word, nourishing us with the words of eternal life. Through these means, the fire of hell, along with the wages of sin and death, are pushed away from us by Christ's cross and empty tomb. Their power is extinguished.

Working through His means of grace, God graciously keeps us connected to our life in Jesus Christ.




