One of the best lines from all of literature comes from Samuel Taylor Coleridge's poem *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner*, a story of a sea voyage gone horribly (and supernaturally) awry. Imagine being lost at sea, surrounded by nothing but ocean. But worse yet, the vast amounts of water that stretch as far as the eye can see cannot provide any benefit.

"Water, water everywhere, nor any drop to drink."

It's not a completely congruent comparison, but people are lost right where we live. Surrounded by churches in our community, many fail to see any benefit from them.



Although salty ocean water cannot provide any life-saving relief, the means of grace, commanded and given by Christ to His church, give the recipient life to the full. Through water and the word in Holy Baptism, God unites the baptized to Jesus and, through the Holy Spirit, brings a flowing river of God-given faith at work as a gift (Acts 2:38). Through the Scriptures, God accomplishes His purpose, drowning the Old Adam and raising the new man to life: "For as the

rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth," (Isaiah 55:10-11a).

Many professed Christians no longer see the necessity for receiving the means of grace. They remain comfortable in their sin, ignoring God's will and command to fear, love and trust in God above all things. They forget to pray, praise and give thanks. They despise the Word of God instead of gladly hearing it and learning it. They fail to listen to the Word made flesh, our Lord Jesus Christ.



God sends His Son not only as a past event but as an ongoing gift. Christ calls us to come to Him to receive His Word and sacrament regularly. Jesus has promised to come to us, abide with us and bless us in this way. (Matthew 28:18-20, John 14:23).


"Water, water everywhere, nor any drop to drink?" Hardly.



Chains

"Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, as preached in my gospel, for which I am suffering, bound with chains as a criminal. But the word of God is not bound!" (2 Timothy 2:8-9).

There Paul sat. He was in a dungeon in Rome. His execution was near. And as he wrote his last letter, he also had to deal with something we don't always consider. He had to deal with the reality of wearing a chain.

In the first century, chains for prisoners were made of rough iron. They weighed an average of 15 pounds. How the authorities placed the chain on you could vary. They might place your chain on one of your legs or both of your legs, on one of your wrists or both of your wrists. Or they might decide to place it around your neck. They might chain you to another prisoner, or they might chain you to all the other prisoners who are there. The chain you wore could be painful. The rough iron would easily rust from your perspiration. The sheer weight of your chain could be debilitating. The noisy creaking of your chain would be constant.

In the darkness of that dungeon, therefore, Paul understood the limitations he faced as a Christian proclaimer of the gospel. All he had to do was see and feel and hear the chain on his body. But he knew something else. He also knew that God's Word was not chained or bound.

As we walk through this life, the Lord calls upon us to share the gospel with others. As we work to do that, however, you and I are painfully aware of our limitations. We know how lazy we can get. We know how fearful we can be. And no one has to tell us how often our sinful behavior has threatened to drown out the very message the Lord wants to proclaim through us.

The chains of our sinful limitations can be many. But God's Word is not chained. The Good News of forgiveness through faith alone in Jesus has a power and a vigor all its own. It is the gospel that pierces stone-cold hearts. It is the gospel that makes alive. It is the gospel that changes destinies one soul at a time. With that in mind, Paul continued to share the unchained gospel. You and I can too.
