Because of Jesus, We Don't Hide From Sin; We Hide in God

After the fall into sin, a terrible realization swept over Adam and Eve. They had never experienced shame before, but it now consumed them. They responded by feebly covering themselves and withdrawing from God's presence, hiding from Him as He sought them in the Garden of Eden. Knowing full well what had happened, God questions Adam, who does not own up to his part in this disastrous turn of events. Instead, the man shifts the blame to Eve and even God Himself: "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate," (Genesis 3:12).

What do you do when your mistakes produce disastrous results? Shift the blame? Deny? Withdraw? Isolate? On some level, this is understandable. Mistakes come with consequences; we can lose standing, trust and even


relationships. Because our bosses, co-workers, family and neighbors might not respond to mistakes with understanding, compassion and patience, it becomes easy to behave like Adam and Eve when we are at fault for something.

It may seem counterintuitive to go before a holy God with our sins and openly confess them. But this is exactly what God desires. As we do so, something amazing happens. David expresses it this way: "Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit," (Psalm 32:1-2). "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,' and you forgave the iniquity of my sin," (Psalm 32:5)

God pronounced judgment against Adam and Eve for their sin, but He also promised His grace – His undeserved favor -- which He would demonstrate by sending a Savior to crush the devil and to bring mankind back to Himself, God accomplished this by sending

Jesus, true God and true man, to keep the law in your place, suffer and die in your place and rise to life again, overcoming sin, death and the devil. In Jesus, God responds in mercy and love to your sins and mistakes.

Because of God's great steadfast love and mercy toward sinners, David tells God: "You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance," (Psalm 32:7). David knows of his sinful condition, yet he proclaims that God is his hiding place. In other words, he knows sin, shortcomings and mistakes cannot be solved by hiding from God, but rather hiding in God. Finding protection and



absolution from sin and shame does not come from withdrawing and isolating yourself from Him, but rather, drawing near to His gracious presence.

Psalm 31 identifies our hiding place in God as the place where God promised to dwell with His people. In the Old Testament, God did exactly that in the tabernacle and later the temple. In Jesus, our Lord has promised to be with us through Word and Sacrament with the express purpose to forgive us, renew us and lead us. According to God's promise, we come into God's presence with joy, confidence and thanksgiving, knowing and believing that God shields us from the sentence and shame of sin, death and the devil through Jesus Christ, our Lord. We approach God together with spiritual songs, hymns and prayers, joyfully hearing and proclaiming "shouts of deliverance." We join David in saying: Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who trusts in the LORD. Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!" (Psalm 32:10-11).





Upcoming Bible Studies

9:30 a.m. Sunday morning Bible study: "Jesus said What" - Jesus doesn't always tell you what you want to hear, but He always tells you what you need to hear. Our Lord has the words of eternal life, and even the hard words of Jesus are given in love. In our culture of sound bites, it's easy for our Lord's words to be taken out of context and misunderstood.
