### The Necessity of Helping a Neighbor

I recently had an issue with a home service provider that took more than a month to resolve. Several calls and numerous transfers during these dark days finally connected me to someone determined to help when so many others couldn't or wouldn't.

This persistent, tenacious representative dug in like an Alabama tick. She made calls to divisions in her own company that put her on hold and hung up on her. But she kept at it. My problem would still be there if it were not for her assistance.



My case illustrates just a minor example of the necessity of helping neighbor in a sinful, fallen, broken and selfish world. For the Christian, job parameters go beyond appeasing superiors so we can draw a paycheck. Our God-given vocations call us to care about others and help meet their needs.

After all, we were all once powerless, helpless and hopeless when it came to being right with a Holy God. But God gave sinners with this deep and abiding problem an even bigger savior in Jesus Christ. Through his suffering, death and resurrection, Christ brings forgiveness of sins, life and salvation to all those who believe. (Keep in mind no one has any hope of saving him or herself. Everyone needs God's gracious and merciful rescue from sin, death and hell, a pardon only granted in Christ.)

Because of Christ, we don't need our works for salvation, but our neighbor may have need of our works. We can't save people like Jesus can. But sometimes, people get stuck in the things needed for daily life. They lack expertise in certain areas. They fall prey to bureaucracy and lack of care. They need help.

That's why Paul urged people not to be idle and to view their vocations with purpose: "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ," (Col. 3:23-24).

When it comes to human need, what you do matters. What you say matters. How you conduct yourself matters. Your vocations won't lead you to greater heavenly reward, but they are a great heavenly trust through which you can show God's love to others serve for those who get stuck.

Maybe your seventh-grader has a math problem that has her brain twisted in knots. Maybe your elderly neighbor needs help getting those heavy groceries into the fridge. Maybe the one on the other side of that phone call really needs someone to care when others can't or won't.

As someone recently in this predicament, I want to say thank you in advance for anything you can do.
