Why so much singing in church service?

One of my friends from a different church background once attended services at the church in which I grew up. When I asked him what he thought about the service, he responded: "You Lutherans sure like to sing."


Although we have long had a rich music ministry here at Beautiful Savior, you may have noticed even more singing and chanting in our traditional service. Perhaps you wonder why. Although many have expressed a longing for this change, some have described the practice as "too Catholic." Maybe others view it as antiquated and out of date.

But singing has long been a part of worshipping the one true God. David Baker and Timothy Saleska wrote in their Bible study on the Psalms: "A little more than 3,000 years ago, King David appointed 4,000 Levites - about a tenth of all the Levites - for choir and musical service at the tabernacle. David appeared to regard the role of music and song as so important to the worship of God's people that he himself composed numerous psalms for worship. It is likely that under his leadership, the psalm became the background music for the worship, offerings, sacrifices and festivals for God's people."

The continued use of the psalms and development of Christian hymnody shaped the worship life of the early church. St Paul urged the church in Colossae: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God," (Col. 3:16).

During the Reformation, Luther did not abandon the role of music within the worship life of the church. Instead, he embraced it, writing several hymns and chants still used in our services today. In fact, Luther insisted that "next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise."

Think about the role music plays in celebrations. We hear special hymns and songs played throughout the church seasons. Special songs ring out during holidays such as Christmas, Easter, Fourth of July and New Year's. From sporting events to birthdays, songs help us to celebrate.

The worship service is a place where God comes to us with His gifts of Word and sacrament, descending with His presence to commune with His people. The liturgy celebrates God's gracious activity with prayers, praise and giving thanks. What greater celebration could there be this side of heaven?

There are other reasons as well. Songs help us to learn and retain information. (The alphabet song provides just one example.) Singing the liturgy also helps to articulate words more clearly. For all these reasons, I hope you will see the benefits of the additional traditional elements in our worship as something to celebrate!

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? The Bible tells us that Jesus Christ is truly and fully God. So, who is going to get in his way? Who or what can stand in the way of the Almighty? The answer seems obvious: nothing.

It seemed obvious in the movie "Forrest Gump" that little Forrest and Jenny were inseparable. Maybe you can recall one of his famous quotes, "Me and Jenny goes together like peas and carrots." Forrest and Jenny seemed to do everything together, until one day life got in the way. Is that the way you feel sometimes about Christ's love for you? It just seemed like one day life got in the way and his love for you had vanished.

In our sinful weakness, we can be convinced at times that this is the case. God's Word tells us plainly that believers in Jesus are given no guarantees of an easy life. Jesus told his disciples, "In this world you will have trouble..." (John 16:33). We face hardship. Burdens weigh heavily on us. We live through times of want. When those troubles press down on us, we are tempted to wonder, "Does God really love me? Is he truly there for me?"

Into the darkness of those doubts, the apostle Paul shines the brilliant light of God's assuring Word. The answer to those questions of doubt is a resounding "YES!" God does care for you. Yes, he is there for you. Nothing can separate you from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. The Son of God gave his life on a cross for you. He rose again to give you eternal life. Those are accomplished facts which cannot be undone or nullified. No trouble, no force, no period of time, no space, nothing in all of creation can stand in the way of God's love for you.

Someone once said, "When you doubt God's love for you, read the end of Romans chapter 8. When you get done, read it again. And when you get done again, read it yet again." ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord, (Romans 8:35-39).
