Hard Habit to Break

My scale recently confirmed my suspicions: COVID-15 had claimed another victim. The first symptoms arrived weeks ago when I had some mild discomfort in my abdomen and trouble breathing because my belt had become too tight. Soon after, many of my pants and shirts followed suit.

How did this happen? An added 15 pounds appeared out of nowhere! Well, maybe not. In the wake of the coronavirus pandemic, I went out less; cooked a lot of brisket, pork, and other assorted meats on the grill; and developed unhealthy snacking habits. If I know what's good for me, I will have to correct course and change those unhealthy habits that have become so comfortable.

The pandemic also has affected our worship habits. Some of you are not worshipping at all. Many of you may have become accustomed to watching services online. With this option, everyone can choose their time for service, watch it in pajamas, relax in a comfy recliner, and fast forward over the portions of the service they don't want to hear. After a while, the thought of going to church in person seems far less appealing.

an excuse to indulge the sinful nature, which does not want God's Word to convict us, bring us to repentance and change us through the power of the Gospel.


God's Word always works through any medium, but when we withdraw from in-person worship, we leave God's gifts unopened as we refrain from receiving the Lord's body and blood, given for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins. We miss out on our vocation as part of the body of Christ to support, walk with and serve one another.

As the fall draws near, prayerfully consider your worship habits and

discern what changes would be healthy for you. The Word itself creates a hunger and dependence on being regularly fed by that Word. And unlike the COVID-15 fallout, feasting on what the Lord provides is good for us! It gives us true sustenance and strength.

As David declares: "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him! Oh, fear the LORD, you his saints, for those who fear him have no lack!" (Psalm 34:8-9).


SAFETY PROTOCOLS



Rally Sunday is right around the corner, and we wanted to give you an overview of Sunday School this year. There have been a few changes, and we want to let you know the steps we have put in place to try and help keep you safe:

- •Rally Sunday is Sept. 13: this will be the first day of Sunday school.
- •The time will be 9:30-10:10 a.m. *Please note this is 20 minutes shorter than last year!
- •The location will be a little different we will meet in the sanctuary the whole time we will start with singing and move right into our lesson as a whole group (PreK to fourth grade)!
 - -This could change pending how many children attend, but right now we feel it is best to keep everyone in the sanctuary so we can be physically distanced during Sunday School.
 - -Older grades will meet in their classrooms and will be assisting with the younger children's lessons as they are interested.
- •Masks are highly encouraged due to the singing that will occur.
- •You will need to come into the Sanctuary to pick up your child at 10:10 a.m.
 - –Please keep your child with you and refrain from wandering around the church between Sunday School and the next church service (10:30 a.m.).
- •We will be sanitizing the Sanctuary between Sunday School and both services.

We are changing up the lessons a little bit as well. We have decided to use the VBS program, Rocky Railway, as our first five Sunday School lessons to kick off this great year! Instead of sending everything home in a box for you to try and complete on your own, we will focus on one lesson each week during Sunday School. Activities, crafts, and/or experiments will be provided to the children at the end of the lesson so they can take it home and share the main lesson idea with their family. We will walk through the instructions during Sunday school so they can see what they will be doing at home.
